
Save the Date!

EVER CONSIDER BEING A HOST FAMILY?



A host family is a vital part of the cultural exchange, immersing the student in a variety of activities while in the host country. The host family plays a large role in offering the student a view of another country and gains the opportunity to learn about a new culture from a young leader. Rotary provides detailed information to help prepare host families willing to explore

the challenge of welcoming a student into their home for a meaningful exchange. Hosting is a tremendous experience in which you can share in a young person's hopes and dreams and develop a lifelong connection with a student and family from another country. It can be challenging to help a young person transition to a new culture and ease into the surroundings but the rewards are immeasurable. Host families in the Youth Exchange program come in all shapes and sizes. They can be Rotarians or non-Rotarians, and may include young children, older children, or no children at all. Host families are need for our incoming Rotary Exchange students. Typically a student is placed with a host family for approximately 3 months so that a visiting student has the opportunity to experience several host families during their year with us.
