
☐ Joint Meeting with Kiwanis on Sept. 8.

McNeil Talks Fundraisers!

Rotarian Dan McNeil, Executive Director of the Spring Forward Leaning Center, loaned his expertise in non-profit fundraising to Rock Island Rotarians as our guest speaker at Tuesday's meeting. Dan has served as Executive Director for River Action, The Figge Art Museum and now Spring Forward Learning Center. Dan emphasized that any non-profit event must be made special to have any hope of success. He said there are always two goals for such fundraisers: first, to raise money; and second, to raise awareness of the mission of the hosting organization.

McNeil said that there are two main considerations in planning a fundraising event. First, something must make the event unique so potential donors will be interested in attending. Second, great consideration must be given to who will help. There must be a significant corps of people willing to work in planning and presenting the event.

As examples Dan turned to his own experiences with local fundraising events. As Executive Director of River Action he was involved with the "Taming the Slough" fundraiser. It was unique in that it was the only activity in the area that combined canoeing, off road bike riding, and running in one event. It is also the only event of its type on the Mississippi River. He was able to gather ample help by involving local canoeing, biking, and running associations, along with media sponsors. When Executive Director of the Figge Art Museum, Dan was involved with the "White as Paper" fundraiser. It involved planning a dress in white social event around a display of contemporary art. The idea was unique to the area his help came primarily though a working committee and board. His final example was the upcoming "Night At Marando's" fundraiser for the Spring Forward Learning Center. It is the first Gala event attempted by Spring Forward. It is unique in attempting to recreate the nostalgia and fun of Marandos Supper Club in the 50s and 60s, complete with a live big band for dancing and dinner items off the original Marando's menu. His help again comes from a working committee and dedicated supporters of the Learning Center. He also was able to enlist the help of local media and surviving members of the Marando family.

As we have frequently found to be true, often our best programs are those provided by our own members. Today's presentation by Dan McNeil proved again how true that is! Thanks Dan!
