of 2015 graduated 388 students; Rock Island High School celebrated 32 juniors who were named as Charles O. Austin Scholars, and we look forward to who will come to the top as the National Merit Scholar Commended or Semi-Finalist. Oberhaus also lauded numerous awards won by District athletic teams, band and chorus, and science, robotics, and engineering competitors.

Looking forward to the 2015-16 school year, the district has seen a slight decrease in enrollment this fall, however Superintendent Oberhaus expects to see it even out after the Labor Day weekend. Overall, enrollment has grown by 405 students over the last six years. Rock Island High School has added more Advance Placement and Dual Credit courses to the catalog. The Entrepreneur and Enterprise program was also launched with a renovated classroom and curriculum that relies heavily on community business and organization leaders to be involved as mentors. The mentors will teach part of the curriculum and help guide students through building their own product and business model. Next spring, the program will host a "Shark Tank Week" and have student pitch their business models to potential investors. Oberhaus thanked Rotary for contributing \$10,000 to help get this program started. See OBERHAUS page 2

There has also been an expansion of STEM (science technology engineering mathematics) programs at the elementary and junior high level. A new program at Eugene Field Elementary, Learn Enrich And Discover (LEAD), is based on the Leader in Me program from the Seven Habits of Highly Effective People by Steven Covey. Every two weeks, all of the students at Eugene Field have the opportunity to explore 1 of 24 activities for an entire Friday afternoon. In addition, students in 5 and 6 grades go on campus visits to our local colleges and universities. Many community partners are helping the school with this endeavor.

Financially, the district is looking at another deficit this year of \$1.9 million due to a shortfall in revenue sources. Assessed values of property finally increased last year, after two years of decline. The good news is that the State of Illinois passed a budget for education and increased the state aid funding level to 92%, which is an increase over last year's funding level of 89%.

Dr. Oberhaus thanked the Kiwanis and Rotary Clubs for their support over the last year. Both organizations have made a tremendous difference to students - the Kiwanis Club provided school supplies (valued at \$95,000) for the First Day Project to more than 4,500 of our RIMSD students, and the Rock Island Rotary Club generously donated \$10,000 to help fund the start-up of the Entrepreneurship and Enterprise Class. "Together, as a community, we will all be successful."


