Club to hear Rock Island Mayor Dennis Pauley's 2016 "State of the City" address. It was obvious that Rock Island is a very active and thriving community. The mayor began by acknowledging the hardworking members of the city council, including Rotarians Chuck Austin and P.J. Foley. Alderman Stephen Tollenaer was also in attendance along with Rotarians Thomas Thomas, Rock Island City Manager; and Jeff Eder, Rock Island Economic Development Director.

Mayor Pauley proudly announced that Rock Island has a **balanced budget**, holds a "AA" bond rating, and four the fifth consecutive year will not be raising the city property tax rate. He then proceeded through a long list of ongoing city activities and achievements.

In the area of **public services**, the Mayor stated that technology has been significantly updated including 4G internet capability in all police and fire vehicles. Police vehicles have also been equipped with live video capabilities.

The mayor said the **Rock Island library** has had an extremely active year having more patrons than in past years and more resources checked out by citizens. Expanding the downtown library is currently under study. The **King Center** celebrated its 40th Anniversary by hosting its first "black tie" event. During the year the center served 21,860 citizens, and hosted a summer day program for 160 kids. The Metro Youth Program drum and drill squad made 54 appearances during the year including the McDonald's Thanksgiving Parade in Chicago. The King Center served 1,224 meals at their annual Thanksgiving Dinner, and hosted nearly 500 kids for their Christmas party.

The **Parks and Recreation Department** introduced new programs to assist lower income citizens to ensure they could participate in camps, fitness activities, Whitewater Junction, and golf. New golf leagues were introduced and were successful. At Douglas Park all of the wooden bleacher seats were replaced and old wiring was replaced with underground wiring, both in the hope of promoting youth baseball at Douglas Park. Mayor Pauley announced that improvements in the Rock Island **Fire Department** led to the city's ISO improving from "4" to "3", meaning that insurance rates charged to Rock Island Residents should decrease. Communication equipment has been up graded, a Rescue Boat was purchased allowing for improved emergency service on the Rock and Mississippi rivers. All emergency fire department vehicles now carry state of the art paperless reporting systems for our EMTs.

ROTARY DISTRICT GRANTS Rotary



THE KIDS WERE CONDUCTING A "COIN DRIVE" AND WE PUT OUT A DONATION BOX TO HELP. THE EARLYACT MEMBERS (ALL 5TH AND 6TH GRADERS) WENT FROM ROOM TO ROOM AT JORDAN SCHOOL TELLING ABOUT THEIR PROJECT AND EXPLAINING HOW THE CHILDREN THEY HOPED TO HELP HAD NO CURRENT SOURCE OF SAFE, SANITARY WATER.

ROCK ISLAND ROTARIANS PITCHED IN AND SENT A BIG BAG OF CHANGE (AND BILLS) TO ADD TO THE TILL. BUT THOSE KIDS ... THOSE INCREDIBLE EARLYACT KIDS WITH A GOAL OF \$500, RAISED \$2,256.84! SO RATHER THAN PROVIDING SAFE WATER FOR KIDS IN JUST ONE VILLAGE, THEY HAVE ENOUGH MONEY TO SUPPLY EIGHT VILLAGES WITH THE PURIFICATION EQUIPMENT. IN RECOGNITION OF THEIR EFFORTS, YOUR ROTARY BOARD VOTED TO PROVIDE A PIZZA PARTY FOR THE CLASS THAT RAISED THE MOST MONEY.



Rotary condemns deadly attack on polio security personnel in Pakistan

Rotary members and our partners in the fight to eradicate polio offer our heartfelt condolences and express a deep sadness in the wake of a horrific bomb attack in Quetta, Pakistan, that took the lives of at least 15 security personnel on 13 January.

This tragic attack outside a polio immunization center is a stark reminder of the dangers faced by Rotary, our partners in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, and the brave women and men on the front lines of our effort to protect all children from the paralyzing effects of polio. While the bombing will be investigated, one thing is clear: The security personnel who were killed died because their job was to protect teams of polio immunizers. We applaud the government's commitment to continue the vaccination campaign throughout Pakistan, which is one of only two countries where the poliovirus is still endemic.

Today we pause to honor the sacrifice made by the heroic police officers killed. Yet our 30-year commitment to end polio remains steadfast. Even as we absorb the horror of this bombing, we are redoubling our efforts to educate families and build confidence in the safety of polio vaccines, and to engage community and religious leaders to support our campaign.



We are closer than ever to achieving a polio-free world. Vast improvements have been seen in Pakistan, with more than 80 percent fewer cases in the country than in 2014. In order to stop polio in Pakistan in 2016, we must ensure the safety of vaccinators to reach every child.

And today, our <u>release of \$35 million in grants</u> for polio eradication signals our determination to finish the job to which thousands of courageous individuals have committed themselves, and to never forget the sacrifices made by those who lost their lives in this effort.

The Rock Island **Police Department** recently moved into our new state of the art police station featuring indoor parking for squad cars, a new crime lab, an "all under one roof" evidence storage area, and improved areas for police to interact with the public. An improved communications system is also part of the new facilities.

The **Public Works** Department didn't have to deal with flooding this past spring and spent its time repairing streets, signs, and replacing sidewalks. They also undertook an experimental project sealcoating alleys and asphalt streets. The policy of charging assessments for new streets was eliminated, and a large 20 block sewer replacement project was undertaken on 6th Avenue.

Mayor Pauley reviewed a long list of **Economic Development** achievements, including construction of more housing units, the new Metro bus station, Unity Health System's new Emergency and Heart facility, the new RI Animal Hospital, Hawk technology, Medical Marijuana facility, and many more. He reported that plans for the new Walmart Super Center remain on track with a Walmart surveying team working the new site just in the past month. The Mayor also announced that the city is currently working on updating the city zoning code and listed a number of new housing developments in the city including the Zimmerman Lofts that will house both commercial and residential tenants and is owned by Rotarian, Mark Zimmerman. The Mayor also announced that on January 14th a new Heritage Harvest Grocery will open in the downtown area. The Mayor concluded his remarks mentioning that parking meters had been removed in the downtown area and parking hours increased to 4 hours in most areas. He also lauded the opening of Mo's Burgers & Brews, Gunchies, Nila's Chicken & Fish, Roosters, Cabanas, and several other new entities. In summary he said Rock Island continues to work with our partner cities and strongly supports regionalism. He said, "We can accomplish much more by working together". Kind of sounds like a Rotarian doesn't he!
