Nimitz, recounting his experience on the ship in 2015 at today's meeting of Rock Island Rotary. The Nimitz is a supercarrier of the United States Navy, and the lead ship of her class. One of the largest warships in the world, she is designated CVN 68 (nuclear-powered multi-mission aircraft carrier) and was commissioned on June 30, 1975. The ship was named for World War II Pacific fleet commander Chester W. Nimitz, who was the Navy's third fleet admiral. P.J. was taking part in a program designed to provide government officials and political/community leaders with a greater appreciation of America's military forces. The "by invitation only" program caused Foley to fly to San Diego and board a Navy transport plane at NAS North Island in San Diego, which flew PJ and others in the group to the Nimitz cruising 150 miles out in the Pacific.

The Nimitz was ordered in March of 1967 and was built by Newport News Shipbuilding at a cost of \$1.0 billion (1975 dollars). Its home base is Naval Base Kitsap in Washington state. The ship is huge, displacing 110,250 tons. It is 1,092 feet long and 252 ft across the beam. Even at that huge size the Nimitz' two Westinghouse A4W nuclear reactors propel it through the water at over 37 miles per hour. Its range is unlimited and it's atomic fuel is expected to last 20–25 years. Onboard is a ship's company of 3,200 and an air wing of 2,480.

P.J. told of experiencing landing aboard the Nimitz and equated it to "running into a brick wall". Taking off, he advised that holding the head firmly against the seat back is critical to avoid the whiplash than can be caused when catapulted off the ship going from a dead stop to several hundred miles per hour in just seconds. Having a personal friend who was also a personal friend of the Nimitz' Captain lead to P.J. being invited to dine with the Captain in the Captain's quarters the first evening on board. He said the food that night was "awesome". Subsequent meals were served with the QuarterMasters, where the food was "very good". P.J. said he requested dining with the everyday sailors, but that didn't occur. He thought the "mess" there might be another level lower, but couldn't say for sure. Overall his visit was exciting and one of the most memorable experiences of his life. In addition to being up close to some of the Navy's top supersonic fighter jets, transport planes, and helicopters, P.J. also got to meet and become friends with several State Department officials who were his roomates for the cruise. Since returning home he has had the opportunity to maintain those friendship during his frequent trips to Washington, D.C. on behalf of St. Ambrose University.
