PROBING THE PRIVY



Rock Island Rotarian, Kevin Koski introduced his younger sister as “The second smartest member of the family”. Ann Koski showed she also inherited a bit of the “Finnish” wit, retorting that yes indeed, “Mom was the smartest”. Ann, an anthropology graduate of the University of Michigan with master’s degrees from both Northwestern and Eastern Illinois Universities, presented a moving program entitled “Privies to Plumbing, a History of the Toilet”. Now retired, Ann served as Director of various



Museums, ending her career at the Historical Museum of Madison, Wisconsin. She now is an active consultant and has appeared as an expert on numerous television programs, including the popular, *Antique Roadshow*. Through photos and humorous narration Ann took Rotarians on a stimulating journey from the earliest Greek and Roman marble (and very public) latrines, to medieval castles with offset public “seating”, dropping waste into the moat, to urban areas where waste was thrown into the street and allowed to wash through channels to nearby streams and rivers, to colonial America where the traditional “outhouse” gained popularity and wide use. Ann showed photos of outhouses built at the end of piers, allowing raw sewage to drop into rivers, privies built overhanging the edge of cliffs allowing

waste to drop over the cliff, and outhouse attached to barns. There were even two story outhouses (watch out below)! Her talk then flowed into the development of the modern bathroom, beginning with the “Thunder Mug” found under the bed, whose use was reserved primarily for the ill and elderly, to the early toilets that “flushed” with finely ground soil as opposed to water. Ann informed the club that the push for a modern toilet system came about after Louis Pasteur discovered germs and people began to understand sanitation and risks caused by raw waste in water and privies saturating soil near wells that provided water for cooking and drinking. She pointed out that the modern bathroom brought three functions together that had typically been separate. Toilet facilities, which were previously outdoors, washing facilities which previously were bowl and basins in bedrooms, and bathing which had primarily been a weekly function performed in portable tubs brought into the kitchen on Saturday night. That weekly fun event lost much of its glamour when Ann pointed out that one tub full of water first served the oldest male in the home, often grandpa, followed in age order down to the youngest boy. Then the oldest female got her turn followed in age order by all other females. The last to bathe was the baby, hence the phrase “Don’t through the baby out with the bath water”, because by the time baby got the tub, the water was typically a bit murky to say the least! Ann’s comments conclude with a review of the evolution of toilet paper. In early Roman times it was a sponge attached to a stick and a scraper, then came corn cobs, followed by newspaper, catalogs, and finally perforated paper. Overall Ann taught us everything one might want to know about a modern convenience we take for granted! Thanks Ann for a fun and informative program, although I must admit that all this talk about toilets has me a bit flushed!

DISTRICT RECOGNIZES OUR CLUB!

Last week we reported that Rock Island Rotary dominated the annual Rotary District Awards presented at the District Conference. This week, District 6420 published a press release touting our accomplishments. In part the District release reported,

"Rock Island Rotary received a number of awards and recognitions at the Rotary District Conference in Rockford on April 29 – May 1 in Rockford. The local service organization was recognized for the best "Project of the Year" for the Entrepreneurship and Enterprise Class at Rock Island High School. Rock Island Rotary provided financial support and volunteers to get this innovative class started in cooperation with the Rock Island-Milan Education Foundation.

Steve Morenz, First Vice-President of Rock Island Rotary won the award for Officer of the Year for his work to expand membership and for his leadership in fund raising.

Three literacy awards were received in recognition of the partnership with Earl Hanson School and other efforts to improve literacy in the Rock Island community. Rock Island Rotary regularly donates books and school supplies to Earl Hanson School. In 2015 the club donated over 200 books to children enrolled in the Summer Youth Enrichment Program.

Finally, the "Governor's Citation Award" was given by District Governor Jim Nelson in recognition of Rock Island Rotary's growth in membership and support for the Rotary Foundation. Only four of the 48 clubs in Rotary District 6420 received this special award.

At midmorning, the group -- numbering some 9,000 members from 80 countries -- made its way through the congested streets of Rome, past the tight security surrounding St. Peter's Square, and settled into the area reserved for Rotary in front of St. Peter's Basilica for the Jubilee audience. Francis, a 79-year-old Argentine, urged the crowd of more than 100,000, which included members of the police and armed forces from around the world, "to build a culture of peace, security, and solidarity around the world." In attendance was Gary Francque, a Moline Rotarian and father of our EarlyAct teacher/sponsor, Jennifer Heckenkamp.
