The third Tuesday of each month is designated as "Foundation Tuesday", a notation designed to remind each of us of our commitment and obligation to support the Rotary International Foundation. This Foundation Tuesday, our Foundation Chairman, Bud Phillis, didn't talk about the Foundation and all the good works it accomplishes worldwide. Rather he introduced former District Governor, Bob Newlon, a Rotarian that lives and breaths the Rotary

"Service Above Self" motto. Bob has been extensively involved in Clean Water projects throughout the third-world for many years. More recently he has turned his attention to sanitation, realizing that it is much easier to provide clean water once sanitation issues have

been taken care of. Bob doesn't speak just in theory, he has walked the walk, taking 12 humanitarian trips abroad with three more on his current schedule. The more he traveled the more it became evident that the problem of sanitation is a major barier to improving thirdworld health. The challenge seems impossible. What is needed is a

toilet system that requires no water, can be permanently located without the need to periodically move, does not require pumping or digging out, has limited offensive odor, provides a biodegradable system of waste control, and provides a way to recycle solid and liquid waste for productive use. Oh, it would also be nice to provide a facility for washing hands after toilet use. No big deal, right? Well. Bob put his engineering education and experience to work on this daunting task and invented the "BOB Toilet". Recently he took his invention to a remote barangay (village) in Samar, Philippines to test it in actual 3rd world conditions. "The BOB Toilet", a biodegradable, zero waste toilet invention that doesn't use water. Yes, believe it or not it does not use water. It uses rice hulls and banana leaves to help decompose human waste and turn it into fertilizer. The urine is diverted to significantly reduce

the smell and is also used as organic fertilizer. The slanted roof of the toilet collects rain water so school children and adults can wash their hands and promote hygiene and sanitation. The result of his test, an overwhelming success! So much so that the Rotary International Board of Directors presented the 2015-16 Service Above Self Award to Bob. The RI Board created this award to recognize those Rotarians who truly embody Rotary's motto of 'Service Above Self.' The board considers this award to be Rotary International's highest honor to bestow on a Rotarian, since a maximum of only 150 Rotarians may be selected from over 2.1 million members of Rotary. Bob brought a model of his invention to our club and along with an instructive slide presentation showed how the Bob Toilet is made and how it works. Best of all, the cost per unit is about \$85. Expect to see Bob Toilets all over the third-world followed by a significant improvement in sanitation and health through areas where previously 80% of human waste is left openly on the ground. Thanks Bob for a great program and your outstanding dedication to the ideals of Rotary. Our support of the Rotary Foundation can ensure that innovations like the Bob Toilet don't just sit on the shelf. Help make a difference!
