Past Club President, Andrew Guzzo, shared knowledge learned in his banking career in hopes of helping all of us recognize and avoid the many scam artists preying on citizens throughout the world. Andrew identified some of the most common scams as callers who say they are with Windows or Microsoft and that they are receiving information from you computer of viruses of other threats and they ask for remote access into your computer to "fix" it and say it is critical that you act now. Once you let them in they corrupt or delete all your files and offer to "fix" it for a fee, often hundreds of dollars. He said even agents of ISIS

are working to gain access to your computer to steal information and/or money. Amazingly Andrew reports that some of the best professional scammers are now creating and selling "Exploit Kits" to less sophisticated would-be scammers. The Kits teach them how to scam! Andrew then went through many of the scams currently operating in our area: 1) Telemarketing Fraud. This scam asks you to send money or give personal information over the phone in order to claim a prize or help a friend or relative in need.

2) Nigerian Letter. This scam aledges that you have won or been names an heir to a fortune and asks you to just pay the taxes or fees to they can send the money to you.

DON'T DO IT! 3) 419 Fraud. This scam says that certain government or bank officials are holding a large sum of money (typically in Nigeria) and asks you to help get the money out of the country. They want to transfer it to your bank account or want you to help fund a payment (bribe) to the official to get it released. Either way thay make you an accomplice to a crime and extort money from you thereafter. 4) Identity Theft. A very common scam that can occur anytime we are careless with our personal information. Do not discard anything with your social security number, or account numbers on it in any form that could be read by someone intercepting your trash! Be vigilant 5) Health Care or Insurance Fraud. This scam appears in may anytime you hand your credit card to anyone!! forms. It might be billing for services not received or charging for equipment you didn't order or receive. 6) Phishing Scam. This scam sends emails alledging to be from your bank or broker, of some other entity you deal with and asks you to verify information such as your password, account numbers, etc. Andrew says legitimate entities would never ask you to send this type of information via email. 7) Pharming Scam. In this one the scammer has actually hijacked a legitimate web address that you are familiar with and again asks for sensitive private information. Andrew again says legitimate entities will never ask you to send that type of information via email. 8) Social Network Scam. Here the scammer get into your computer through social networking (Facebook for instance). It may gain access by something that just says "click here for free App" or asks you to open an attachment. DON'T DO IT! Once they get into your computer they can retrieve all sorts of personal information. In summary Andrew said, "Keep your Security Program running and updated. Ignore unsolicited emails that ask you to open an attachment or click on a link. THANKS ANDREW, this could be the most "valuable" program we've had this year!.
