Shelley Cain of the Eastern Iowa-Western Illinois (EIWI) Regional Girl Scouts visited the Rock Island Rotary Club to talk about their program. The EIWI region includes over 27,000 scouts with 700 of them in the metro Quad Cities. The activities are plentiful, and the Girl Scouts program is in many schools as an outreach program. She also

said that Girl Scouts are making an effort to reach out to the growing Latino population. The Girl Scouts continues to be the leading leadership training program for girls with an emphasis on service to community. The older girls are offered the opportunity to take trips both regionally and internationally as well as a chance at scholarships for higher education. Girl Scouts regularly visit nursing homes and last year provided over 109,000 hours of service in our region.


The first thing you think about when someone says "Girl Scouts" is "cookies." Not only are Cookie sales the major fundraiser for the Girl Scouts, but the project is also used as a tool to teach financial literacy. Girls learn to set goals, create a marketing plan, and handle money.

The Girl Scouts recently renovated Camp Conestoga and it is now known as Camp Liberty. Camp Liberty features a new, modern lodge with indoor facilities, meeting rooms and sleeping areas. The camp also has a

high ropes course and an Equestrian arena. In all, the renovation is a \$4 million project supported largely by donations and grants.

Ms. Cain concluded with a plea for volunteers to serve as Girl Scout leaders, and men are very welcome to be leaders!
