A native Texan, Jacqueline came to the River Bandits after 4 seasons with the Sugar Land "Skeeters" in the Atlantic League serving as their Director of Corporate Partnerships and the team's

on-field host. Miss Holm is excited to be with the Quad City organization and proudly recounted the awards and recognitions earned in 2015. The Quad Cities

was named the Best Minor League Sports Market in the nation by the Sports Business Journal. Davenport was named the 3rd Best Minor League Town in American of both Single-A and Double-A cities, by SmartAsset. Ballpark Digest named Modern Woodmen Park the Best Single-A Ballpark in America. LivAbility Magazine included Modern Woodman Park in their alphabetical list of the 10 Best Minor League Ballparks for 2015. The Bandits even won awards for the Single-A Baseball's Best Cap and Best Promotion Jersey. Finally, the Quad City Times named the River Bandits as the Best Family Entertainment in the Quad Cities, and Modern Woodmen Park as the Best Place for a Kid's Birthday Party. When asked about attendance, Ms. Holm pointed out that attendance has been on the rise steadily over the past nine years with 251,559 attending games last year and average per game attendance up again this year (now over 4,000 per game). Beyond awards, Jacqueline was excited to speak about the Bandit's Charitable Giving. Last year the Club made more than \$300,000 in charitable contributions to our community. Genesis Health Services Foundation receives half of all amusement ride revenue, which in 2015 reached \$50,000 and gained national recognition from Ballpark Digest. The Bandits also fund 3 full tuition college scholarship for Quad City area students. An organization is named the evening of every Bandits game as the Organization of the Night. In 2015, 55 organizations raised more than \$25,000 at Bandit games. During the season more than 80 baseball games are played at Modern Woodmen Park. In addition to baseball, the Park also has banquet and meeting rooms which host proms, weddings, school events, holiday parties, and corporate meetings. In 2015 more than 150 non-baseball events were hosted. Jacqueline concluded with a sneak peek at some of the new "thrill" rides in the planning for addition in 2017. After watching the video, Sam Wray asked, "Do we pay or do you pay us to ride on those rides!" All in all, it was an interesting and informative program adding to the excitement as we approach our own Rotary Night at the Ball Park coming up on August 19th.
