#### **Annual State of the Schools Address**

Rock Island-Milan School District Superintendent Mike Oberhaus gave the Annual State of the Schools Address on Tuesday, Sept. 9 at the joint Kiwanis/Rotary service club meetings. Reviewing the 2015-16 school year, Dr. Oberhaus reviewed many positive achievements. The Class of 2015 graduated 388 students; Rock Island High School celebrated 40 seniors who were named as Charles O. Austin Scholars. These students consistently achieved a GPA of 3.5 or higher for the first six semesters of their high school career. Dr. Oberhaus also lauded numerous awards won by District athletic teams and the Rock Island High School Marching Band.

Financially, the district ended the year with a \$700,000 deficit. The good news is that the State of Illinois passed a budget over the summer to fully fund education for the 2016-2017 school year.

New this 2016-2017 school year, the district is implementing a math curriculum called Eureka Math, which will help students with problem solving methods as opposed to relying on memorization. The district is also implementing a new English Language Arts curriculum. An important focus for this year is on enhancing positive relationships with students and their families to improve student success and increase interaction with families and engage them in education.

Dr. Oberhaus thanked the Kiwanis and Rotary Clubs for their support over the last year. Both organizations have made a tremendous difference to students - the Kiwanis Club provided school supplies (valued at \$95,000) for the First Day Project to more than 4,500 of our RIMSD students, and the Rock Island Rotary Club generously donated \$10,000 to the Entrepreneur program last year.

#### 50 Things Every Rotarian Should Know About Rotary

#### 6 - THE 4-WAYTEST

One of the most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics in the world is the Rotary "4-Way Test." It was created by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor in 1932 when he was asked to take charge of the Chicago based Club Aluminum Company, which was facing bankruptcy. Taylor looked for a way to save the struggling company mired in depression-caused financial difficulties. He drew up a 24-word code of ethics for all employees to follow in their business and professional lives. The 4-Way Test became the guide for sales, production, advertising, and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company was credited to this simple philosophy. Herb Taylor became president of Rotary International during 1954-55.

The 4-Way Test was adopted by Rotary in 1943 and has been translated into more than 100 languages and published in thousands of ways. The message should be known and followed by all Rotarians.

"Of the things we think, say or do:

- 1. Is It the TRUTH?
- 2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- 4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?"
