Roger Ruthhart is Managing Editor of the Dispatch/Argus newspaper. Mr. Ruthhart received his BS and Graduate Degrees in Journalism from Bradley University. He is active in our community, serving as President of the Rock Island Grand Prix; Board Member of the Rock Island Arts & Entertainment District; Board Member of the Northern Illinois Newspaper Assn.; and Board Member of the Illinois Associated Press Media Editors. The Argus, founded in Rock Island, is one of Illinois' oldest continuously published newspapers. It can trace its origin to 1851 with the founding of a weekly paper called *The Republican*. It became Rock Island County's first daily two years later after it was purchased by Colonel J.B. Danforth. Because Danforth was a staunch member of the Democrat Party he had the paper's name changed to the Rock Island Argus. The newspaper was purchased by John Potter in 1882 when the paper had 500 subscribers. The Potter family operated the newspaper until 1986 when it was bought by the Small Newspaper Group. The first issue of the Moline Daily Evening Dispatch was produced in July 31, 1878. It was started by Oliver and Louise White, who were publishers of The Molly Stark, a weekly newspaper in Toulon, Illinois. Competition forced them to sell the paper to Patterson S. McGlynn and John K. Groom. In the early to mid-20th century the paper was under the leadership of Harry Sward, Lee R. Blackman and August Sundine. It was under Sward's leadership that the paper's identity changed from one focused on Moline to Western Illinois and it became The Daily Dispatch. The Daily Dispatch was purchased by Len H. Small on February 28, 1969. After the Small Newspaper Group acquired the Argus in 1986, the operations of the Argus were gradually cut back and combined with those of the Dispatch. Today, the two newspapers have merged and are now known simply as the Dispatch/Argus. Ruth discussed political news coverage and acknowledge that some news organizations have become opinion oriented and offer their own slant to the news. He said his hope is that the Dispatch/Argus remains a neutral source of news and said they try very hard to research and verify what they report and felt that because they get "Hammered" from both sides they are probably being fair and staying in the middle. Ruthhart said that some newspapers have stopped doing endorsements of candidates and referenda issues; however, the Dispatch/Argus continues to endorse and believes that their endorsements provide a community service. "Our Editorial Board conducts interviews with the candidates and asks the questions that are important to our community. We don't tell people how to vote, but do provide them with the answers we received from the candidates and our opinion of how the positions the candidates take will impact our community". In some key races, the Dispatch/Argus offers the candidates an opportunity to spell out their positions on the issues and prints verbatim what each candidate says. Ruthhart concluded saying that more and more news is carried in their on-line edition where not only printed word can be carried, but also video clips and various other visual sources of information. 15 - SHARING ROTARY WITH NEW MEMBERS

Are you aware of the responsibility or obligation most Rotarians fail to perform? Paying their dues? Attending meetings? Contributing to the club service fund? Participating in club events and projects? No-none of these!

Of all the obligations a person accepts when joining a Rotary club, the one in which most Rotarians fail is "sharing Rotary." The policies of Rotary International clearly affirm that every individual Rotarian has an "obligation to share Rotary with others and to help extend Rotary through pro posing qualified persons for Rotary club membership." It is estimated that less than 30 percent of the members of most Rotary clubs have ever made the effort to propose a new member. Thus, in every club, there are many Rotarians who readily accept the pleasures of being a Rotarian without ever sharing that privilege with another qualified individual.

The Rotary policy on club membership states: "In order for a Rotary club to be fully relevant to its community and responsive to the needs of those in the community, it is important and necessary that the club include in its membership all fully qualified prospective members located within its territory" One merely has to glance through the yellow pages of the local telephone directory to realize that most clubs have not invited qualified members of all businesses and professions into Rotary

Only a Rotarian may propose a customer, neighbor, client, supplier, executive, relative, business associate, professional or other qualified person to join a Rotary club. Have you accepted your obligation to share Rotary? The procedures are very simple, and everyone must know at least one person who should belong to Rotary.
