and Gerry Huiskamp. Kevin and Gerry accepted the honor on behalf of the organization which has spearheaded the effort and fund raising to completely renovate Rock Island's historic Douglas Park. The 2018 Excellence Award was also presented to a group. Two of the founders of "LEAD", Corneilus Aldridge & Romar Cantu, were honored for their Rock Island Entrepreneurship Class creation, which provides leadership training, and mentoring for low-income elementary school children. Dr. Bud Phillis presented a moving tribute to Rotarian Fred Luckenbill who was honored posthumously with the Rotary Lifetime Achievement Award. The club was honored to have Fred's wife, Nancy Luckenbill, and daughter, Beth Ford, present to accept the award. The final award presented was the prestigious A.T Peara "Service Above Self Award". This award, which may only be won one time, is often tabbed recognition as the "Rotarian of the Year". Our honoree for 2018 is Steve Morenz. Steve served as our president in 2016-17. During the past year he has been a leader in club fundraising projects, membership efforts, and our partnership with the Heart of Hope Food Pantry. In addition, Steve served in various capacities on virtually every project Rock Island Rotary undertook during the year. Congratulations to Steve and all our outstanding and deserving honorees. Keynote speaker for today's luncheon was Mr. Steve Bell, head football coach at Augustana College. Coach Bell spoke on the topic, "Excellence", which he defined as a talent or quality which is unusually good and so surpasses ordinary standards. He asked if excellence lead to success or if success leads to excellence? He then noted that excellence in his opinion equals growth, learning from experience, and living life with a purpose. Relating "Excellence" to his team members, he said being excellent means be the best you can be, master your craft, don't settle for average, and be able to handle failure. He left us with an equation: E+R=O and then explained the Event, plus ones **R**esponse to the event will equal the **O**utcome. He said we can't control the event, but do have control over how we respond, and that will determine the outcome. The Awards Luncheon Committee under the leadership of Chris Lemon put together a very well organized and impressive program. Foundation Minute

In Brazil's Riberia Valley, a neonatal intensive care unit faced a problem. It didn't have nearly enough equipment. With only seven incubators, the unit at the state-run Dr. Leopoldo Bevilacqua Regional Hospital filled up quickly. Newborns often would be transferred to another facility - a harrowing journey that the tiny, fragile patients sometimes didn't survive. This factor contributed to the hospital's high mortality rate.

The Rotary Club of Registro, Sao Paulo, stepped in to help, partnering with the Rotary Club of Nakatsugawa, Gifu, Japan, on a global grant. They raised funds to purchase equipment, including incubators, cribs, ventilators, and monitors, and launched a publicity campaign about the importance of prenatal care and breastfeeding. The clubs also provided training for at-risk pregnant adolescents and education on maternal-infant health.

The new equipment doubled the capacity of the unit, which now provides care t o220 of the community's newest and tiniest residents each year.
