in Toronto provided her vision and goals for the coming year, starting with the declaration, "I love Rotary"... She then spoke of what an important factor Rotary has been in her life, stressing that it gave her an opportunity to grow personally and professional. She spoke of the many people Rotary has given her the opportunity to meet and know. Drawing on our 2018-19 Presidential motto, she said she hoped each of us would "Be the Inspiration" to bring others into our club. Stressing that she wants to "think big", Sue set goals for membership growth at 5 to 10 new members. Sue wants our club to become bigger and better! She urged us to not only recruit members, but to get involved with humanitarian service, and to make the commitment that each Rotarian will give \$100 per year to our Rotary International Foundation. She noted that just a \$10 per month automatic withdrawal will more than meet that goal. Sue also wants to strengthen our relationship with Interact and Rotaract and suggested that Augustana Rotaract members might pair up with a Rotarianin in their chosen field of interest. She urged us all to get involved, to offer and share ideas, and to ask ourselves, "Why did I join Rotary?" The most important factor in bringing in new members, particularly millenials, is to show them why to join as opposed to just telling them how to join. Sue saiys she hopes to do things a bit differently than in the past, starting with reducing time spent at meetings making announcements. She urged members to read each newsletter and also hopes to use the video system at meetings to convey announcements and messages. She also urged our club to continue our work in Rotary's 6 Areas of Focus: Promoting Peace, Disease prevention and treatment, Water and sanitation, Maternal and child health, Basic education and literacy, Economic and community development. **CHANGING OF THE GUARD**

ROTARIANS AT WORK!

Turkey is home to more than 2.7 million Syrian refugees, according to the United Nations. To promote understanding among Syrian and Turkish schoolchildren, the Rotaract Club of Izmir Ekonomi trained young students to become partners in peace. Working with the Council of Europe, European Law Students' Association, the UN, and child psychologists, the Rotaractors hosted two workshops, asking the children to express their feelings through painting. The artwork revealed that the students had a lot in common. Club members also taught the children conflict resolution skills.

For establishing peaceful relationships in the community, the Izmir Ekonomi club received the 2016-17 Rotaract Outstanding Project Award for Europe, the Middle East and Central Asia.
