others. Donna leads training in the areas of Leadership, Team Building, Communication, Leadership, Change Management, Emotional Intelligence, Supervisory Skills and Coaching to either Executive or small group, as well as Career Development Coaching. With 20 plus years of training and education experience, Donna has a Master of Arts Degree in Adult Education from the University of South Dakota. Dr. Ben Palmer defines Emotional Intelligence as, "Emotional Intelligence is about making intelligent responses to negative feelings, and using specific skills to generate positive emotions in self and others through being present, empathetic, genuine, resilient and empowering in our behavior as often as possible." In a nutshell, Emotional Intelligence (EI) is about managing our emotions. EI is a set of skills that help us better perceive, understand and manage emotions in ourselves and in others. These behavioral skills help us make intelligent responses to, and use of emotions. Honold believes these EI skills are as important as your intellect (IQ) in determining success in work and life. Everyone has interactions with other people. Your ability to understand your emotions, to be aware of them, and how they impact the way you behave and relate to others will improve your "people" skills and help you ultimately be more satisfied and successful as a manager, supervisor, and leader. Genos International helps professionals apply core emotional intelligence skills that enhance their self-awareness, empathy, leadership and resilience. In our world of 'do more with less', applying emotional intelligence at work is fundamental to success. In the most simple terms, Emotional Intelligence refers to our ability to manage our emotions. Mrs. Honold led club members through a relatively simple exercise asking each to recall and picture the best boss or person ever worked with, and conversely, the worst boss or person ever worked with. Then through a series of six questions she was able to point out that those in the "best" group typically managed to control their emotions and no matter what their personal fellings, were able to display positive emotions that made those around them comfortable, at ease, and willing to work hard for their boss. Those in the "worst" group were found to be poor managers of emotions, often seemed touchy or angry, and made working around them tense and uncomfortable. Honold noted that similar exercises can be used to evaluate prospective and current employees, and for self evaluation. A very interesting and enlightening program. Thanks Mike Locander for bringing it to us!

Foundation Minute

In 2017, the majority of The Rotary Foundation's global grants were awarded to clubs and districts outside the United States; however, many of our US districts have recognized immediate needs within our own country. Working within the grant process:

- 1. A health service center was created in Salinas, California to assist homeless residents in their community and helped them obtain references to healthcare professionals.
- 2. In Greensboro Alabama, Rotary provided financial literacy and small business development trainings for at risk youth.
- 3. Rotary provided a social and job skill training program targeting unemployed and underemployed residents of West Coconut Grove, a Bahamian founded community in Miami, Florida.
- 4. It equipped a mobile vision unit to serve patients in a region of rural Appalachia.
- 5. And in Up State New York, it developed a grant to address the severe epidemic of opioid/heroin abuse.
