The Development Association of Rock Island and The Downtown Rock Island Arts & Entertainment District, together formed the Downtown Partnership to cohesively advance the downtown and greater Rock Island area as a destination for business growth, job creation, arts &

entertainment, and retail sales. They are pledged to the letter and spirit of U.S. Policy for the achievement of equal housing opportunity throughout the nation. They encourage and support an affirmative advertising and marketing program in which there are no barriers to obtaining housing because of race, color, religion, sex, handicap, familial status, or national origin. GROWTH is regarded as a national leader in developing innovative housing opportunities and commercial developments by facilitating community partnerships, and continues to evolve its organization in order to meet community needs, while remaining true to their mission set forth over 35 years ago. Their community-driven efforts consistently look to create jobs, support and stabilize neighborhoods, and strengthen the community fabric in ways that sustains and promotes long-term viable economic success. Mr. Jones described the numerous programs available for potential home buyers, as well as programs to assist current homeowners with such things as access ramps and accessible bathrooms. Jones also holds monthly classes on such topics as home buying, foreclosure prevention, home maintenance, and other critical topics for homeowners. Personally, Mr. Jones does counseling with prospective buyers to help determine if they are ready to buy a home, if renting is a better option, saving for a down payment, and home maintenance. Growth has various grants available for home purchasers and home improvements which are available based on family income. Most are geared to families at 80% or below the median area income, however some are available for families at 120% of the median average. Mr. Jones best advice was come speak with him and he can identify exactly what might be available. Thanks Mike Locander for another quality program.

### **Foundation Minute**


