

Corps and had been assigned as department pilot, underwater recovery diver, field training officer, tactical officer, narcotics agent and various investigation teams. Mark has taught NIMS classes through both Illinois Fire Safety Institute and FEMA as an independent contractor. Mark retired from Rock Island Police Department in October 2010 and became Chief of Police in Coal Valley, Illinois. Mark assisted in forming a public safety dive team which meets the Class 1 FEMA dive team standards and volunteers as an instructor for public safety diving to police and fire department dive teams. His team has responded to requests for divers from Illinois State Police, and several police and fire agencies throughout Illinois and Iowa and is listed as a resource through ILEAS. Mark is married and has one son. He received an Associate degree in Law Enforcement Technology from Black Hawk College and a B.A. in Business Administration from Marycrest College. His post graduate work was completed at the University of Iowa in Business Administration and Multimedia Presentations. Mr. Palos noted that the work is dangerous, particularly in the Mississippi and Rock Rivers where currents can be very deceiving and treacherous, posing a hazzard even for experienced rescue divers. Poulos formed the group after budget cuts eliminated city operated dive rescue teams. Originally just four volunteer, Poulos said they quickly decided that safety protocals needed to be a top priority. The team offers their service as a resource for area first responders. Their first year goals were to make area police and fire organizations aware that such a resource was available. They also wanted to improve and increase their resources so vital equipment could be obtained. Strengthening their "branding" so the community knows of their existance was also a goal. Finally they hoped to recruit and train new team members. Strict standards were developed including a annual 800 meter, timed, swim test. Many training sessions are held both with cold water dives in icy conditions, and dives in flood conditions. Mark noted that they have determined that any current in excess of 6 mph is too dangerous to put divers in the water. The team has grown to include more divers, medical personnel, writters, boat handlers and safety personnel. They have worked with dozens of agencies, both local and outside our area. The team received some surplus equipment including a truck from the City of Davenport, and through grants have purchased underwater metal detectors, a sonar system, full face masks, and protective dive suits. Each diver has invested approximately \$4,000 of their own money in equipment. Mr. Poulos presentation was augmented with a large selection of photos and an interesting video. The team is a 501C3 charitable organization and does not charge for their services. The team is certified for dives in depths greater than 130 feet, and can perform specialty dives such as confined space/cave dives, ice dives, and hazardous materials and contaminated water dives. Outbound Rotary Friendship Exchange team forming now!

Rotary Friendship Exchange is Rotary's exchange program for adults. Everyone is aware of our Youth Exchange program, but did you know we are getting ready for our first outbound Friendship Exchange in several years? And you can be a part of it! You are probably wondering where we will be going, and do you need a passport or even some exotic shots. The good news is, we will be staying in the United States to help get people acclimated to this program again but the Rotary Friendship Exchange (RFE) committee has big plans for the future.

You may recall that we have had inbound RFE teams from India in our district for the last two years. We were fortunate to share hosting these teams with D6440 and D6450, but we did not actually have anyone from District 6420 travel to India.

If you are still reading you must be curious about when and where we will be traveling. We will be sending a team of 8 people (couples or singles) to District 6200 (Southern Louisiana) from April 18, 2019 to May 1, 2019. The team will be spending time in Houma, Lake Charles, Opelousas, Gonzales and New Orleans. While in Louisiana you will be staying in the homes of Rotarians and enjoying some of their gracious southern hospitality. You will be responsible for your travel expenses to and from New Orleans and there may be other costs associated with entertainment or meals in restaurants but as guests of District 6200 you will be escorted and hosted at most events. You will be visiting other Rotary Clubs and learning about life in the bayou as well as traditions and customs such as Mardi Gras.

REPORT TO THE CLUB

Western Illinois - Eastern Iowa Water Project

Great news! Since purchasing our first filters in September of 2016 our water project has progressed and grown at an incredible rate. Now, just 27 months later we have passed the 200 mark in purchased filters and have 205 units in service providing safe, clean drinking water for more than 14,300 children. This is all possible only because of the great generosity and support of Rotarians and Rotary Clubs throughout Illinois and Iowa. We're pleased to report that several of our partner Clubs and nearly a dozen individual Rotarians have decided to help sustain the project by annually purchasing a filter.

Donations continue to flow in, often without identifying from whom they come or what Club affiliation they represent. It is our intent to recognize all donors as much as possible and to extend our appreciation for your support. Donors that provide us with a contact email receive periodic updates and reports on our progress. If in reviewing the list below you believe we have missed crediting a donation, please send a reply and let us know.

We are still eagerly making presentations to any and all groups that allow us the opportunity. You will notice on the donors list that several youth Interact Clubs have now joined the project. We are thrilled to see youngsters gaining an early appreciation for service above self!

On the down side, we also have received a list of schools identified by Replenish, Inc. and Vestergaard as still having no access to clean water. As donations continue to arrive, we will work through this list and won't be satisfied until all children can have a drink of water without fear of disease or death.

The per unit cost of \$350 includes lifetime maintenance and internal filter replacements for each unit. Our club treasurer reports the following donations have been received as of December 31, 2018: Each filter proudly displays our American Flag, Rotary emblem, and the inscription "Western Illinois – Eastern Iowa Rotary Clubs.
