Western Big 6 Turns 50

Fifty years ago, our local high schools. Rock Island, Alleman, Moline, and United Township, joined with Quincy and Galesburg High Schools to form the Western Big 6 Conference. A voluntary

alliance of schools that has stood the test of time and is today, Illinois' longest standing conference with all original founding schools still loyal members. In fact, it beats all others by many years. During January and February, the six schools will each be hosting "Anniversary Celebrations" at boys' basketball games. Bob Swanson who serves as executive Secretary of the Conference. He pointed out that of the 760 high schools in Illinois, all but a very few are members of conferences. According to Swanson, schools, typically of similar size and geographic location, form conferences to ensure appropriate competition for their school's athletic teams. Conferences also serve as an overseeing agency to ensure sportsmanship, adherence to rules, and to provide recognition and honors to student-athletes. What is so unique about the Western Big 6 is its longevity with all founding members still loyal and strong supporters of the group. Founded in January of 1969, the six member schools, all considered large schools at the time, were surrounded by dozens of rural and smaller town schools who were not eager to play big schools. The lack of large schools on the western side of the state lead to one characteristic where the Big 6 differs from most conferences. Its members are not all geographically near one another. Swanson explained that for a conference to be recognized by the Illinois High School Association for football playoff purposes, it must have a minimum of six member schools. That requirement forced the four Quad City Schools to seek out at least two more "big" schools. Galesburg had already been competing with the Quad City Schools and also had a rivalry established with Quincy Senior High School. Those schools were also large schools surrounded by numerous small schools. Both were happy for an opportunity to help form a conference of six Western Illinois large schools. Galesburg was located nearly fifty miles south of the Quad Cities and Quincy was an additional hundred miles to the southwest. Not only is the Western Big 6 the oldest of all Illinois conferences, it is geographically the largest spanning 150 miles between member schools. It also is unique in having a large disparity between the schools' student populations with Alleman having 430 students, Galesburg with 1297, and Moline over 2,000. Rock Island, Quincy, and United Township fall between Galesburg and Moline. Yet regardless of the travel and irrespective of size the six schools have stuck together, even when individual members were invited to join other conferences. Why? According to Swanson it is a mix of having like-minded philosophies regarding the role of athletics, the importance of academics, and a commitment to fair play and sportsmanship. And, of course, there is always that thirst for great competition. In fact, the high quality of competition has made the Western Big 6 not only the oldest conferences in the state, but the premier conference in terms of prestige of membership. So how has our little six team conference faired in fifty years of existence? How about a total of 32 Team State Championships and 88 Individual State Championships won by the Western Big 6! Next year Geneseo and Sterling join the Conference; the first change in membership in 50 years!

Rock Island Rotarians got a look at what will be the official logo of the Western Big 6 Conference as of July 1, 2019 when Geneseo High School and Sterling High School become members of the Conference. The two new schools requested that the name remain The Western Big 6 and said they wanted not only to join the conference, but to share in the prestige of membership that comes with being part of the Western Big 6. The new logo incorporates an "8" representing the eight-member schools and also shows the name of each school in their school colors. Stars on the Illinois map show the respective location of each school. With the addition of the new schools, the conference will now span 201 miles from Sterling to Quincy.
