Visitors will be surprised to find the large extent of details available, for instance, under "Things to Do" there are details on Kid's Stuff, Arts, Theatre, Music, Museums & History, Gaming & Riverboat, Guided Tours & Rentals, John Deere, Gardens, Parks, Pools, Biking & Hiking, Golf & Sports, and Spas & Health Care. "Trip Starters" includes Free Fun in the Quad Cities, Weekend of Family Fun, Wine Aficionados, Getaway for Adults, Bike, Hike & Explore, Craft Breweries, and Shopping in the Quad Cities. The Quad Cities Convention & Visitors Bureau named Herrell, of Jacksonville, Fla., as President & CEO of Visit Quad Cities on September 11, 2018. He came to the Quad Cities after serving in management positions in Jacksonville, Phoenix, and Nashville. He has a background in destination and brand marketing, administration, operations, strategic planning, business development, fundraising, communications, and non-profit management. He officially began on October 8, 2018. Before joining the Ouad Cities Convention & Visitors Bureau, Herrell led the City of Jacksonville's Office of Sports & Entertainment as their Sports & Entertainment Officer. Herrell led the operation of annual signature events such as the Florida-Georgia Game, Florida-Georgia Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony, Jacksonville Jazz Festival, and the Sea & Sky Airshow to name a few. He further managed the City's Sports & Entertainment Complex Capital Maintenance Fund and was a principal on the \$90M TIAA Bank Field stadium renovation project which included the creation of Daily's Place. He has also held leadership positions with the Arizona Sports Foundation, the Nashville Sports Council, and Music City Bowl, Inc. Throughout his career, he has been involved with hundreds of projects that have yielded more than \$800M in direct economic impact. He has worked on numerous NCAA events, SEC Conference Championships, neutral site college football games, various amateur athletic and national governing body events, multi-day music & entertainment festivals, air shows with The Blue Angels, arts & cultural events, and more. Herrell said after joining over the Quad Cities Convention and Visitors Bureau he changed its name to "Visit Quad Cities" He felt that more directly stated the mission of the group. Mr. Herrell says that tourism equals economic development noting that last year 1.6 million people visited the Quad Cities generating over \$6.1 million in hotel./motel tax revenue. To that add the food, gas, merchandise and tickets purchased and other money spent by the visitors and the impact is huge. He said our area needs to think bigger. There are 37 million people living within 6-hours driving distance from the Quad Cities. Visit Quad Cities hopes to bring many of them here. "Visitors leave their money here when they leave", Herrell noted. We've been competing with Peoria, Rockford and Des Moines and need to set our goals higher. He hopes to go beyond 2 million visitors and \$10 million in hotel/motel tax revenue soon. He said that the last strategic visioning done by the Visitors Bureau was twelve years ago. He said soon Visit Quad cities will lay out a new strategic vision and plan. He made a point to highlight that we all benefit from income brought in through visitors saying, "The \$6.1 million from last year's hotel/motel tax went into area community coffers in place of increased taxed to bring in that amount from residents". He urged us to always be positive about the Quad Cities.

Six Steps To Avoid Overheating

Caution : Never remove the radiator cap if a working temperature gauge has a higher than normal reading in the car. The water when it is in a hot engine and radiator has enough heat to scald if the cap is opened.

1 - Drain and flush the entire cooling system as specified in your car owner's manual. Reverse flushing is more effective that just running water into the radiator.

2 - Check the hoses for cracks, leaks and swelling. Make sure that the clamps are tight. Change the hoses if they are soft compare to a new hose. Don't forget to check the heater hoses as well.

3 - Check belts for tension by pressing down on the middle of the belt at a point about midway between the pulleys. The amount of "give" should not be more th3/8 inch. Tighten if necessary.
4 - Check the coolant level. If it is low, add a 50/50 mixture of water and anti-freeze. Adding water alone will dilute the mixture in the cooling system and the freeze protection will be reduced.
5 - Clean the radiator by spraying water from the engine side. Things that get caught up in the radiator will reduce air flow and in turn, affect the cooling efficiency.

6 -Check the pressure cap with pressure tester. Most likely, you would need to go to a garage to get this done unless you have a tester. (Most people don'thave a tester)

Unsafe To Use Gasoline As A Cleaning Agent

Gasoline is tricky stuff. It vaporizes very easily and the invisible vapors are heavier than air that can spread along the floor to something that will ignite it. Never use gasoline as a cleaner, solvent or charcoal as a starter in your barbecue. To do so is to invite disaster. Gasoline is meant to be fuel for engines.
