Today, for the forty-fifth year, Rock Island Rotary hosted a Luncheon at which some of our community's finest were recognized. Our keynotw speaker was Dan Huber, CEO of Frontier Hospitality Group. founders: Honesty, integrity, compassion, respect and result orientation. Dan has a history of being a high achiever. He was first named CEO of a chamber of commerce at age 25, and became CEO of lowa's third largest chamber of commerce at 29. He has been recognized as a community leader and difference maker in the Quad Cities since 1999. Iowa Governor Terry Brandstad named Dan to the Iowa Department of Transportation Commission in 2014. He currently serves as commission chairman. He spoke on the topic of "Excellence" and stressed through the use of quotations from numerous highly successful people that Excellenc comes as a result of hard work, dedication, and striving for perfection. He said none of us are perfect, but if we strive to reach that goal we will attain excellence along the way. It was a great motivational message leading into our 2019 awards. Lauded for Academic Achievement were Augustana College's top two senior scholars, Zacharay Schrank and Brianna Hillyer introduced by Kai Swanson, Special Assistant to the President of Augustana. Both students have a perfect 4.0 grade point average. Alexandra Cajigal and Sydney Heiller were recognized as the top two students in the Alleman Class of 2019 with introduction by Fr. Daniel Mirabelli. The girls are tied for valedictorian honors with grade points in excess of 4.8. Rocky Assistant Principal Karla Thies had the honor of introducing Rock Island's top two seniors, Aislinn Geedey and Corina Castaneda. They also are tied for Rocky's valedictorian honors. The six scholars were each presented with attractive plaques. The Community Service Award presented to an area resident for outstanding service to our community was presented by Awards Chairman Chris Lemon to Darrell and Mary Anne Reynolds. The award recognized Mr. and Mrs. Reynolds for their dedication and work for the betterment of our community. Although unable to attend the luncheon, Chairman Lemon noted that the Reynolds donated \$100,000 for scholarships at Rock Island High School and \$100,000 for Scholarships at Alleman High School. They also were the major source of funding for the new Alleman Athletic Field and for the renovation of Rock Island's Douglas Park. Last year they funded a new program through the Rock Island-Milan Education Foundation in which former Rocky graduates are brought back to spend time and tell their success stoies to current students at Rock Island High. Rock Island High School senior. Breanna Beal was named winner of the Excellence Award, recognizing superiority in an occupation or field of endeavor and setting a high standards of performance over a sustained period of time. Miss Beal was lauded for her incredible career in high school basketball. Among many honors it was noted that she is the all-time leading scorer for boys and girls in thw Western Big 6 Conference, a 3-time winner of the Illinois Ms. Basketball Award, and 3-time winner of the Illinois Gateraide Player of the Year Award. She is also the first Quad City area McDonald's All American and played in their All American game last month in Atlanta. She will be playing in the Jordan Brand All American Game this Saturday in Las Vegas. In the fall she will attend South Caroline University. Club President Sue Cassatt revealed Bob Swanson as the first recipient of the Luckenbill-Wraw Award in recognition of outstanding dedication and contribution to Rock Island Rotary during the past year. President Cassatt noted that Bob has been a valuable resource and supporter throughout her presidency. She summed it up with, "We all know the many things Bob does for our club". Steve Morenz, last year's winner of the A.T. Peara Award had the honor of introducing the 2019 Peara Service Above Self Award considered the highes honor bestowed by Rock Island Rotary. It is a life-time award and can be won just once. The Award, recognizes a Rock Island Rotary member who has exhibited the dedicated service and faithful commitment to the ideals of Rotary that were personified by A.T. Peara, for whom the award is named. Rotarian John Phillips was named this years A.T. Peara Award recipient. Mr. Morenz noted that John serves on numbers boards and commissions in our community as well as holding numerous committee posionts within out club. He gave many years of outstanding service as Rock Island City Manager and has been a Rotarian for the past 32 years. John served as president of our club in 2015-16 and has frequently entertained us with his mastery of vocals and the 12-string guitar. He was unable to attend today's luncheon, traveling to see his daughter perform in a concert at her college. None the less, he received a standing ovation from the appreciative crowd.


