
BIKING ACROSS EUROPE

Tom Hammar presented our program

today telling about his adventures biking in Europe, in total a 12 day trip with 4 days spent biking in Germany, Austria, and Switzerland. Tom along with wife Sue and two long time family friends flew out of Chicago and ultimately landed in Munich, in southern Germany. In total the trip was a 12 day vacation with four spent biking in Germany, Austria, and Switzerland. Tom presented a interesting travelog complete with color photos. Photos included several castles including Neuschwanstein Castle built on a rugged hill above the village of Hohenschwangau near Füssen in southwest Bavaria, Germany. The Disneyland Castle is said to be modeled



after Neuschwanstein Castle. Wartburg Castle The Martin Luther's haven after the pope condemed him as an outlaw and order his execution. While in the castle Luther translated the Bible from Latin to German, making it accessible to the common people for the first time. Tom's tour also took hin to the homes of Mozart in



Salzburg, Austria and Bach in Eisenach, Germany. He also visited the churches and saw the organs on which Mozart and Bach played. His four day bike trip was around Lake Constance which borders on Germany, Austria, and Switzerland. They biked 20-30 miles each day and staying in bed and breakfast facilties. Their luggage was sent ahead daily and was waiting for them when they arrived. Rooms were comfortable and breakfasts were great, so says Tom. Tom told of seeing scores of vinyards, historic churches, incredible scenery including the Swiss Alps, and enjoying the warm hospitality of the local citizens. He also managed to attend a Rotary function while on the trip and reported that Rotarians in Europe as are welcoming and dedicated as they are throughout the world. Thanks Tom for sharing with us!

Community Grants Committee Member Jim Moran presented a \$600 Rock Island Rotary donation to Rev. Dr. Melvin Grimes, Executive Director, and Betsy Vanausdeln, Associate Director and manager of Winnie's Wishes Shop and the food pantries of Churches United. The funds will be used to support the hunger, shelter, and domestic abuse missions of Churches United. Churches United hosts 25 Food Pantries responding to nearly 140,000 needs for meals annually. They have hot meal food sites in Davenport, East Moline, and Moline with nearly 100 congregations and other groups serving free hot and nourishing meals to over 20,000 hungry people each year. They also have Winnie's Place. a shelter program helping women, with or without children, who are homeless and/or survivors of domestic abuse. Winnie's Place allows the victim to move away from their current situations towards a world of new opportunities. Rotary is pleased to help make these essential services possible.

The Rotary Foundation is changing the world by providing grants for projects and activities around the globe and in our own backyards. Sixty-five million dollars in grants have been given to clubs and districts to fight disease.

Providing clean water: Rotary has worked with partners to provide more than 80 percent of Ghana's people with clean water to fight Guinea worm disease.
