until her youngest started school. During that time she kept her hand in community service as co-chair of a committee to build a new "KidsGround" playground in Rochelle. Bobbi served as president of Rochelle Rotary (2008-2009) and has served at the district level as Assistant Governor Coordinator and currently as Assistant Governor and as Co-Chair of the District's Friendship Exchange Committee. She has worn several professional and avocational hats, as a Chiropractor, adjunct college faculty member, current member of the Kishwaukee College Board, Master Gardener, and is employed by First State Bank as coordinator of the bank's activity and travel club. Bobbi and husband Bob have two married sons and a daughter. She began her comments by stateing that she loves Rotary and what it stands for. Making the world and our communities better is the most nobel and rewarding task we can undertake. Says Bobbi of her love of all things Rotary: "FUN should be the fifth part of the Four Way Test!" Her theme took the form of several challenges. First, she challenged us to think about our meetings and ensure that they are attractive. Elaborating, Governor Bobbi said Rotary clubs need to meet the needs of their communities which may require change. She noted that two clubs in the district folded last year because they were unwilling to change. Meeting frequency and times may need to be altered to fit when prospective members can attend. Activities need to provide opportunities for members and their prospective guests to "get their hands dirty" by being involved in service project. Clubs may need to establish "satellite clubs" offering alternite meeting times and locations to accommodate members ability to attend. Social events need to be included with members encouraged to bring guests. Speaker topics need to be timely and of interest to the membership. She noted that District 6420 is holding steady at 1,700 members as is Rotary International with 1.2 million members; however the lack of growth is concerning. Governor Burke lauded new International President, Mark Daniel Maloney, of the Rotary Club of Decatur, Alabama. He selected the theme, "Rotary Connects the World". She noted that Rotary connects internationally through its programs to eliminate polio, peace and conflict prevention/resolution, disease prevention and treatment, water and sanitation, maternal and child health, basic education and literacy, and programs for economic and community development. Her second challenge to us was, "How will we ger connected?" Recognizing our club's leading support for the Rotary Foundation, she said we are off to a great start in connecting. Our challenge may be more connecting with our own community and connecting with our members and prospective members. Governor Burke concluded her comments by reminding us of upcoming District events including the Foundation Dinner on November 9th, the Mid-Year meetings on February 1st, The President Elect training March 6-8th, and the District Conference on April 24-25 to be held jointly with District 6440 at the Schaumberg Hyatt Regency Hotel. Thank you Governor Bobbi for a great visit!
