the top one or two clubs in the district. He congratulated Bob Swanson and Bud Phillis for our ongoing International Water Project that so far has reached over 14,000 children in Kenya. John Phillips and Bill Stengel were thanked for their work with our local Club Foundation. Our Community Grants Program was cited for all the wonderful help it has provided to multiple community projects and activities and chairman Frank Lambert was lauded. Kathy Lelonek and Dan McNeil were congratulated for their excellent work as our Literacy co-chairs. Chris Lemon was recognized for his work in chairing both our annual Award Banquet and our Blood Drive. The success of our partnership with Earl Hanson school was complimented along with chair, Molly Shattuck. Finally, Jeff Dismer and his excellent and dedicated work in Rotary Youth Exchanges was noted. President Mark then identified two main areas of focus for the coming year: 1) Increasing our membership to 85; and, 2) Promoting Fellowship among our members. He outlined strategies to achieve those goals. First he identified fundraisers and Service Projects and urged members to volunteer to help on the various committees involved. He noted that the chair for each fundraiser has been named so we could hit the ground running with the start of the new Rotary Year. Kathy Trone is chairing our Tricia Night, which has become our most profitable fundraiser. This year a giant raffle featuring a \$1,000 travel voucher and a huge basket of quality spirits will be added to the Trivia Night festivities. Our Wine Raffle is also being expanded with Ruth Lee and Anne McGlynn acting as co-chairs. The Rotary Ramble is being moved back to it's original December date with Bruce Peterson and Kathy Lelonec chairing and Mary and Dick Fislar assisting. Bud Phillis will continue as chair of our Dining Book fundraiser, with sales starting in two weeks. Another successful fundraiser is our Birdies for Charity with Kevin Koski leading the effort. In each case President Mark asked club members to not only participate in and support the projects, but also to volunteer to join the fellowship of planning and running the event by serving on the committees. Mark also noted we are dropping our Dueling Pianos Fundraiser, making it even more critical that the ones we are keeping are successful. A second strategy laid out by Mayeski was upgrading our Public Image effort. Bob Swanson is chairing the committee which has expanded to eight members and already is showing a significantly larger footprint for our club on FaceBook, Twitter, and in newsprint.. Public Service Announcements, along with a steady flow of press releases are in the works. Concluding his comments, Mark asked the Public Image, Membership, Rotary Ramble, and Trivian Night committees to each move to a separate section of the room and then invited all members who have not yet volunteers for a committee to sit in on any that interested them. There was no obligation to "join" the committee, unless interest was peaked and the the member offered to join. As the meeting concluded it appeared that many committees had new members! Good job President Mayeski!!
