LIVES! Photo by MEG MCLAUGHLIN / mmclaughlin@gconline.com Today's program was presented by our own Carrie Crossen.. Carrie brought along a delightful picture presentation of many of her "foster" cats and kittens. As a volunteer for the Quad City Animal Welfare Center in Milan, Carrie primarily fosters cats and kittens, including many that are pregnant or too young to be adopted. By providing a safe and quiet home, Carrie socializes the animals to human interaction, giving them a better chance to be adopted. Carrie began volunteering with the animal shelter in 2007 after she and her husband, Tony, adopted a golden retriever named Sandy. They've since adopted two more dogs and four cats from the center. Carrie says the most rewarding thing is knowing she is saving lives. By fostering cats and dogs brought into the The Animal Welfare Center, a no-kill shelter, Carrie prevents many animals from going to another shelter where they could be euthanized. The shelter only has space for so many. By placing cats and kittens in foster care, the shelter can help a lot more. Carrie said that every cat the shelter takes is spayed or neutered, vaccinated, and put up for adoption. Carrie began fostering cats and kittens in 2013 when she took two cats with litters of kittens owned by a elderly relative to the shelter. The shelter determined that the cats were too ill and malnurished to stay in the shelter. With no alternative, Carrie took them home. After nursing them back to good health she returned them to the shelter.. To date, she has taken in more than 200 animals on a temporary basis. With three dogs and four cats of her own, she keeps the foster cats in an area away from the other animals to reduce stress and prevent conflict. Carrie focuses her volunteer efforts on fostering. She takes cats because they are easier to care for than dogs. Often her "guests" are a pregnant mama, or a litter of kittens who are too small for adoption. She takes them home and cares for them until they are ready to go back to the shelter to hopefully be adopted. Socialization is a big part of getting them ready for adoption. Carrie makes sure they are comfortable with people. Fortunately, Carrie's clients have a high adoption success rate when she returns them. For Carrie the work is a labor of love. "You feel good knowing you made a difference", Carrie said. ."I can have a really stressful day, go home, and I'm playing with kittens. Pretty soon, you're laughing amd forgetting the problems of the day". Because of Carrie's compassion, the shelter has been able to save many lives. Carrie came armed with facts as well as photos, stating that 44% of US households have a dog and 35% have one or more cats. She alson noted that one unneutered female cat will have 3 litters each year with an average of 4 kittens. Those kittens can become pregnant as young as four months of age, having their own litter when they are six months old. In four years time that one unneutered female can be responsible for 20,736 new cats! Bv fostering Carrie helps find homes for kittens and help stop the proliferation by knowing all of her cats leaved the shelter healthy and spayed or neutered. Carrie urged anyone who might like to try fostering to attend a volunteer workshop held at the Milan Shelter the first Wednesday of every month. The shelter provides all needed supplies for those who agree to foster. Carrie's heart of gold showed through today's presentation. Thank you for a great program!





DINING BOOKS ARE BACK!
