### Miss Blackhawk Valley Visits Rotary!



Gabi Lenger, Moline, was named Miss Blackhawk Valley 2019, and continues spreading joy to others through her platform, "Volunteering for Her Success."

Amazingly, Gabi never competed in a pageant before the Miss Blackhawk Valley pageant this past November. She was encouraged by a friend to give it a try, and as she said during her presentation, "I almost passed out when I won!"

Competing in the interview, evening-wear, talent, and social impact categories of the pageant in some ways were second-nature to this very poised young woman who has a knack for musical theater. She recently completed the Walt Disney World College Program, where she got to

participate as a "Cast Member" at Disney. It was here that she participated in a strong volunteer program in Orlando for the Make-a-Wish Walk of Wishes program and said of the experience that "I can create my own magic and it happens through volunteerism."

As a side note, Rotarians asked if she had a fun story to share from her time as a Disney Cast Member. She shared a story about a time that someone lost their prosthetic leg during the Haunted Mansion ride. "No one came back to claim it, so they put it in the lost and found bucket with all the umbrellas." LOL!

When she returned to the QC area, she created, organized, and managed a program called "Gabi's Gifts," a clothing drive with an incredible outcome. Within just 2 weeks she had collected more than 1000 items of clothing. Partnering with Churches United and Winnie's Place, clothing was distributed to women, many of whom used the clothing to dress up for job interviews. Gabi reported that some of the women were able to secure jobs, due to the professional clothing. Her next large-scale project will be a feminine hygiene drive for those who cannot afford the often expensive products. Look for a lot more from Gabi in the near future.

Miss Blackhawk Valley is an official local preliminary program of the Miss America organization and provides scholarships for the young women of seven counties in western Illinois. Gabi used her scholarship money for her studies at Black Hawk College, where she recently earned her Associate's Degree. She is heading to Augustana College this fall to finish her undergraduate studies in Multimedia Journalism and Mass Communication. As Rotarian Kai Swanson pointed out during the Q & A, "There's going to be a Rotaract Club at Augustana, and they're going to need a PR person." Good luck in school, Gabi. We think you'd be a perfect fit for Rotary!

#### **Our Water Project Update**

Three years ago we began this adventure with enthusiasm and hope that Rotarians from Illinois and Iowa could make a real difference in the struggling lives of children in rural Kenya. Sam and Hilde Wray stepped up with a major contribution and as Jackie Gleason used to say, "Away We Go"! Since that time, scores of Rotarians and nearly 20 Rotary Clubs have joined the campaign! To date the number of children receiving safe, sanitary drinking water in rural Nairobi, Kenya is approaching 15,000 as a direct result of our project.

One of the most gratifying aspects of the project is seeing the results first-hand. This past week we received photos from the Sango, Mwiraria, Nyawacha, and Ligongo schools. Also, they included a link to a short video thanking us for the clean water provided by Rotary.

Be sure to notice the stickers on the filters in both the photos and video. These are filters that YOU have helped provide and these are children who YOU have helped save! The stickers clearly show the filters came from our Western Illinois – Eastern Iowa Rotary project. 
