You may remember former Rock Island Rotarian, Katie Thompson, as the Executive Director for Spring Forward Learning Center, or any of the other non-profits she has successfully led or volunteered for during her years as a Quad Cities young professional. But what you may not know is that Katie has started a new life, and she did so when she exclaimed during a recent vacation, "2019 is going to be *my* year." And her year, it is!

Katie now owns her own interior design company, In Her Own Eyes, with the design philosophy of "I believe space is meant to be ever-evolving and beautiful just like what nature provides to us on a seasonal basis." In addition to this new business, she created THE

Market: A Journey to Joy, a year-round, indoor, market to highlight the works of local makers, crafters, and curators. There are also foodtrucks on location on various dates/times.

In addition to the shared space of the 38 vendors, there are also four special events per year. Her goal is that by April 2020, THE Market, will have given back \$20,000 to community organizations. The first special event is The Market's 2019 Strength in Style Fall Fashion Show. Doors open at 3:30PM Saturday, September 21, in the Spotlight Event Center. There will be a fashion show at 4:00PM, with "Sip, Snack, and Shopping" afterwards. Strength comes in all shapes and sizes. Quad City survivors will model everything from active to party wear and showcase the many styles of strength in our community. Attendees will also get exclusive sneak peeks and first dibs on THE Market's fall clothing lines from the fabulous vendors! All proceeds benefit Family Resources Survivor Services. Rotarians also had a lot of great questions for Katie regarding THE Market. Such as:

Are gift certificates available? Not at this time.

Do you have a relationship with the theater? Not affiliated with one another, but supportive of each other. **Are there any permanent vendor spaces available?** No, they are completely full.

How do you become a vendor? To be a guest vendor, there is a simple application process. Her goal is to

have variety! To be a permanent vendor, which operate on 6-month contracts, it is a more tedious process. Contact Katie for more information.

Where do most visitors come from? All over! Both sides of the river and from far away. The bridge detour actually leads people by the shop, so traffic has been good!

You can visit THE Market at the refurbished Scottish Rite Cathedral, 1800 7th Avenue, Moline. Hours are Wednesday through Friday, 10am—6pm; Saturday 10am—5pm; and Sunday 12-4pm; closed Monday and Tuesdays. The Market doesn't *yet* have a website, but you can friend them on Facebook or Instagram.

She did a magnificent presentation about the recent collaboration between First Tee of the Quad Cities, Boys & Girls Club, Rock Island Parks and Recreation Department, and the Martin Luther King, Jr. Community Center. The collaboration includes a shared 12 passenger van that can haul participants of the First Tee program between the golf courses and the other partners' locations. During non-peak golf months, partners will also be able to use the van for educational and recreational needs. Sara said that the goal was to "Pool resources and impact the child at every level so they can succeed in the classroom." The group plans on partnering on some other projects in the future which she said is going to be "BIG!" We look forward to hearing more from Sara in the future.
