ROCK ISLAND HIGH SCHOOL ORCHESTRA

Today Rock Island Rotarians enjoyed the annual visit of director, Katie Benson, and members of the Rock Island High School Chamber Orchestra. The Chamber Orchestra made up of select musicians from the High School orchestra program, presents many performances each year throughout our community. Mrs. Benson became conductor of the high school orchestra in 2015, under her leadership there are now more than 240 students in grades 7 - 12 in the orchestra program. Rock Island High school now has two orchestras under Mrs. Benson's direction. Today our program was presented by a portion of the Chamber Orchestra. The 18-member group began with Johann Pachelbel's *Canon in D Major* written by the German composer in 1648. That selection was followed by a composition titled *Iditarod* composed by Soon Hee Newbold in 2010. A riveting and explosive work

with the sled dogs running the Iditarod. The orchestra's third selection was an excerpt from the score of the popular Disney feature film, *Frozen*, composed by Kristen Anderson-Lopez and Robert Lopez. The orchestra then presented the Christmas classic, *Sleigh Ride*, composed by Leroy Anderson. Wikipedia says the composer had the original idea for the piece during a heat wave in July 1946 and finished the work in February 1948. The orchestral version was first recorded in 1949 by Arthur Fiedler and the Boston Pops Orchestra. "Sleigh Ride" was a hit record on RCA Victor and has become one of the Boston Pops' signature songs. The group's final selection was *St Paul's Suite in C Major* by the English composer Gustav Holst. Finished in 1913, but not published until 1922 due to revisions. In case you are wondering why a British composer would name a symphony after a Minnesota city ... he didn't! It takes its name from St Paul's Girls' School in Hammersmith, London. The orchestra was given a standing ovation from an appreciative large Rotary audience. Mrs. Benson noted that the Orchestra will give its winter concert, open to the public at Rock Island High School on December 3rd at 7pm in the high school auditorium. Today Rotarian, Dan McNeil stepped into the spotlight and told about his "Journey" to get to his present position as Director of the Spring Forward Learning Center. With many students attending our meeting today, Dan decided to focus his comments on his journey. Dan was raised in Davenport and attended Davenport High School where he excelled in Soccer, but according to Dan, not so much in the classroom. He ended up not graduating with his class and attended summer school to earn his diploma. He thought his future might be in the military, but his older brother who was a marine, talked him out of it. Dan began a "career" at Happy Joes as a "dough technician" and eventually worked his way up to store manager. He met his future wife, Elizabeth, who he describes as "the most beautiful

woman in the world". She convinced Dan to enroll at Black Hawk College where he earned his Associates Degree and then went on to Western Illinois University earning his bachelor's degree in 2006. Dan then worked for various not for profit organizations including serving as Director of Development for the Figge Art Museum from 2007 to 2010; Vice President of Marketing for the Putnam Museum 2010-2012; Project Manager for River Action and Partners of Scott County Watersheds, 2012-2014; and then in 2014 became Executive Director of Spring Forward Learning Center. Dan is now near completion of his master's degree in Education, anticipating a 2020 graduation. Dan and Elizabeth have a son, Leo, now 12 years old excelling in both soccer and school! FOUNDATION MINUTE

In his June 1917, address at the annual Convention of Rotary International in Atlanta, Georgia, Arch Klumph asked his fellow Rotarians to "not live for themselves alone, but for the joy in doing good for others." And so was born the motto of The Rotary Foundation: "Doing Good in the World." Inspired by Klumph's admonition, members of The Rotary Club of Kansas City, Missouri, made the first contribution to the Foundation in the amount of \$26.50. Over a century later, more than 35, 000 clubs, comprised of over one million members, have followed the Kansas City example. They have made monetary contributions in a concerted effort to promote world understanding through the improvement of health, the support of education and alleviation of poverty.

According to the November 2019 edition of The Rotarian, the following countries represent the top 6 (out of over 200) donors to The Foundation over a five-year period by dollar amount(\$US):

United States \$395,699,358 India \$88,875,333 Japan \$84,467,802 Korea \$79,249,818 Taiwan \$53,105,767 Canada \$40,799,946 The icing on the cake about these donations? 92% of funds are spent on program awards and operations.

The Rotary International Foundation

Last week we learned about our Club Foundation, today Bud Phillis brought us up to date regarding the Rotary International Foundation, noting that funds from the Foundation are leading the fight to stamp out polio from the world. He also pointed out that the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation continues to match all funds donated to the Foundation on a 2 to 1 basis, meaning a 1-dollar contribution becomes a 3-dollar contribution for the Foundation. Gates has often said that the reason he donates through Rotary is the fact that the Rotary Foundation is among the most efficient and effective charitable organizations with more than 92% of funds donated going to those in need as opposed to administration and bureaucratic expenses. Bud also commented that recently four new cases of Polio have shown up in Africa, an indication that our work is not done. We are very near eradicating Polio, but it is a tough enemy and won't go away easily. More immunizations are needed, and Rotary is at the forefront to see that the vaccine and health professionals to administer it are provided.
