entered the University of Iowa where he earned his master's degree in Public Relations/Image Management in 2017. For the past three years he has also served as an Adjunct Instructor at St. Ambrose teaching public speaking. He has served as a free-lance writer for the Quad City Symphony Orchestra and has worked on several political campaigns including those of Ken Croken, and presidential campaigns for Hillary Clinton and Elizabeth Warren. He also spent over 8 years working as a Digital Marketing Specialist for the Genesis Health System. Established in 1986, The Project of the Quad Cities is a nonprofit, community-based organization that provides the Quad Cities area with case management and support services for those infected with or affected by HIV/STI/AIDS, in addition to prevention, testing, and education to the community at large. The mission of The Project was originally a Commitment to Action in the Battle Against HIV/STI/AIDS. However, the Mission has evolved and is now simply, "Transforming lives through remarkable care". The Project provides access to no-cost PrEP (pre-exposure prophylaxis) and PEP (postexposure prophylaxis) to prevent HIV transmission, no-cost mental health counseling and support groups, and no-cost testing and treatment for Hepatitis C. Primary care for LGBTQ+ individuals and families is also offered and identity care including hormone therapy will soon be added to the organization's services. The Project provides services in seven distinct areas: HIV/AIDS Services including wellness services and financial assistance to ensure a high quality of life for people living with HIV; **Hepatitis C Services** including testing and treatment for Hepatitis C through the wellness program. Financial assistance is available if needed; Counseling provides mental health services focused on people living with HIV, the LGBTQ+ community, and victims of crime. Group and individual counseling is available at no-cost; Health Services including same-day STD testing, results, and treatment and PrEP and PEP to prevent HIV transmission; LGBTQ+ Health Care providing primary care for individuals and families. MyIdentity Care including hormone therapy for people transitioning; **Pharmacy** through Two Rivers Pharmacy convenient access to discounted prescriptions is provided with no membership required; and Home-Based Care Services through an Outreach & Prevention team provides services where it's convenient for the client—in their home, Mr. Mitchell presented his information with the help of an excellent PowerPoint display which he humbly noted would be the most fantastic PowerPoint we would ever see!. He stressed that all services provided in the Project clinic are absolutely without charge regardless of race, creed, or social-economic status. He also was very proud of the fact that their on-site Pharmacy is a 340B pharmacy meaning that they can provide no or low-cost medication and receive reimbursement from federal sources. When asked about the clinic's response when a patient needs more extensive care or treatment, Tyler said that they have a close relationship with the Genesis Health Group's Infectious Disease Center in Davenport and their staff of doctors. Patients are referred there if their needs exceed what the Project can provide. He also announced two upcoming events. On June 4th from 6 to 11pm the project will sponsor "Pride at Bass Street Landing". This event is FREE to the public and will include food, drag performances, live music, education, and the outreach team will be on-site providing free HIV/STD testing. On June 17th The Project and the Quad Cities River Bandits will host Pride Night at Modern Woodmen Park with free pride t-shirts while supplies last! Every ticket purchased will benefit The Project and LGBTQ+ patients and clients. We thank Tyler for a most informative presentation!

It's Week 3 of Rotary International's Youth Service Month.





BOARD VOTES TO FUND FIRST TEE & SERVICE ABOVE SELF SCHOLARSHIP WITH GENEROUS DONATIONS

Two years ago, Fred & Virginia Houlton made a substantial unrestricted donation to our Club which, because of the pandemic, had not yet been designate for use. More recently Mark Zimmerman made a substantial unrestricted donation as well. Yesterday our Board of Directors voted to use the Zimmerman donation as the club's share of our District Grant application for 2021-22. That application requires the Club to supply \$1,000 which in turn will be matched by a \$1,500 grant from Rotary District 6420. The \$2,500 total will be used to provide scholarships for 40 Rock Island Youth to participate in the summer First Tee Golf camp. The Board also voted to apply \$5,000 of the Houlton donation to our new "Service Above Self" scholarship for Rock Island High School Students. This seems highly appropriate since prior to retirement Fred was a lifelong educator and an administrator in the Rock Island School System. The donation forms the permanent foundation for the scholarship allowing future funds raised to be used for annually presenting scholarships to deserving Rock Island graduates. Our sincere thanks to Mark Zimmerman and Fred & Virginia Houlton for their generosity and commitment to Rotary.





DR. LARRY TADLOCK BESTOWED "HONORARY STATUS"

Our Club Board of Directors voted unanimously at its May meeting to name Larry Tadlock an Honorary Member or Rock Island Rotary. Honorary status is granted for dedicated, long-time commitment and outstanding service to Rotary. Larry became a Rotarian in 1969 while living in Granite City, Illinois. It was our good fortune that he relocated to Rock Island and opened the Quad City Animal Hospital, an institution he owned and operated until his retirement. He served as our Club president in 1974-75 and was the driving force in sponsoring the creation of the Milan Area Rotary Club. Through his philanthropic generosity, Larry was named a Rotary International Foundation "Benefactor". He was our A.T. Peara Award winner in 1982, the first




such winner after A.T. Peara received the introductory Award. Larry is a Paul Harris Fellow and through generous contributions has bestowed that honor and many members of his immediate and extended family. Since retiring Larry interest in woodworking had a chance to blossom and his monthly donations of handcrafted bowls, candle holders, and decorative wood dishes became a highlight of our Rotary Foundation raffles. Hearing the call, "I'll take the bowl", became the norm when winners were given the choice of money, wine, or a Dr. Tadlock item.
