PRESIDENT ANGELA CAMPBELL

Our final meeting of the 2020-21 Rotary Year featured President Angela Campbell's final address to the club. To say she presided over one of the most difficult years in our

107 year history might be an understatement. Angela entered office in the middle of a pandemic. At the time our club was meeting exclusively virtually via Zoom.

It was not until the 11th month of her 12 month tenure as president that Angela had the opportunity to call an in-person club meeting to order and to "ring the Rotary bell". While many clubs lost members and interest and some failed to meet for months at a time, Angela lead our club with weekly virtual attendance of from 35 to 45. We had guests speakers and excellent program every week, actually increased our membership, and continued participation in both fundraising and community service. We also had a significant number of new Paul Harris Fellows recognized during her term. Angela missed the social opportunities of greeting members at our annual Holiday Party, throuwing out the first pitch at our annual Night at the Ball Park, and greeting members each week at the Botanical Center dining room. Those events were all cancelled by the pandemic until our live meetings were resumed last month. She also was limited to inducting new members via Zoom and actually inducted herself when she took office. Board meetings were also held virtually for the majority of Angela's term. Through it all Angela remained poised, confident, kept her sense of humor, and provided steady leadership. Angela said that when Frank Lambert recruited her to start through the chairs of Rotary Leadership he mentioned that she would get to attend the Rotary International Convention in Hawaii during her presidential year. She would get to throw out the first pitch at the Rotary Night at the Ball Park and would ride in style through the Labor Day Parade. She could be a part of the monthly Birthday Books celebration at Earl Hanson Elementary School, and accompany the kids to the Pumpkin Patch for our annual Pumplkin Palooza! Unfortunately, none of that happened when Covid struck. She did however have plenty to highlight for the past year. At her Presidential Training seminsar she met and had a great photo with Rotary International President Holger Knaack and attended meetings with him. She said he was an incredible man and a thrill to meet. She then turned to our Club meetings which for the first 10 months of her term were confined to ZOOM. Even so she was proud of the Club accomplishments during the year incouding obtaining a District Grant which provided dining chairs and equipment for Christian Care in Rock Island. Our Birdies for Charity "virtual" campaign set a record for the most we had every raised for our Club Foundation. We had a successful Bell Ringing for the Salvation Army, did a modified Pumpkin Palooza for the 1st and 2nd grade children at Hanson School, and gave grants to Ballet Quad Cities, Dress for Success, Ridgewood Elementary School, the German-American Heritage Society, the Mississippi Valley Blues Society, and Understanding Works NFP. The Club also provided hand sanitizer to local non-profit organizations, provided Angel Tree gifts for needy children, helped fund the renovation of a Teen Center in Brazil, did two voluntary service day projects at the Botanical Center (stringing Christmas lights, and spring gardening/planting). We held a record breaking Wine Raffle to fund a new Fred Houlton Service Above Self Scholarship for Rock Island High School students, and held an outdoor "make-up" Birthday Books celebration for Earl Hanson kids. On top of all that, we made a major contribution through our Club Foundation to the Rock Island Public Library Foundation Campaign, and a major contribution to Christian Care for creating a public shower facility. We also cointinued our support of the High School Incubator Entrepreneurship Program and conveyed "Honorary" member status on five of our long-time, loyal members. We also helped fund five scholarship for area 4-H youth and once we reconvened live meetings, hosted a wonderful Awards Luncheon honoring students, community members, and fellow Rotarians. So, while the whole country was huddled up at home hiding from the pandemic, President Angela led our club to new and great achievements. Service Above Self shown brightly in Rock Island! We can all be very proud of our outgoing President and of our club. Angela left us with one final act of service, presenting to us a beauful Rotary quilt she made to be used as we see fit for a future rundraiser or raffle item. Thank you Angela for all you did!

FOUNDATION MINUTE

Welcome to the last week of June, the Fellowship Month of Rotary International.

News from Italy reports that sixteen Rotary Clubs from Romagna (Northern Italy) have responded to the needs of the Romagna healthcare system. Joining forces, they participated in a Global Grant funded by The Rotary Foundation. The 78,000 Euro grant (\$93,092 USD) made it possible for the clubs to launch a telemedicine project for the assistance and home monitoring of patients that have had cardiac devices (pacemakers, defibrillators, and resynchronizers) implanted. "Remoteheart" is a project based on the remote control of the latest generation of implantable cardiac devices, which allows communication with a transmitter in the patient's home that then sends technical data, parameters, and clinical information to the patient's doctor. Thanks to the Romagna Rotary Clubs, this project will now be extended to the whole of USL Romagna.


