remote keynote addresses to audiences ranging from 100 to 3000 individuals. Ramirez enjoys partnering with individuals and organizations to identify their assets, areas for development, and strategic focus to maximize their capacities and impact. Ramirez has led Diverse Stretegies Now for the past 13 years. Mr. Ramirez has been a member of the Society for Human Resource Management for the past 15 yrs and spent a year as Director of Operations of the United States Hispanic Leadership Institute. He was vice president of Group O, in charge of Government Relations & Diversity from 2011 to 2014 and was President of the Greater Quad Cities Hispanic Chamber of Commerce in 2010. Mr. Ramirez has also been politically active, serving as Executive Director – White House Initiative for Hispanic Education and was Special Assistant to The President and Associate Director of Personnel in 1993. He received his Bachelor of Arts Degree from Columbia University and did his graduate studies at Baruch College in New York City.

We are honored that the Rock Island Rotary was his first presentation since March 2019! He didn't seem rusty at all. In fact, if you missed today's program, you really missed out. The first part was interactive, where Rotarians quizzed themsleves on their level knowledge and comfort when discussion equity, diversity, and inclusion (EDI). Although many felt somewhat comfortable at the beginning of the presentation with these concepts, many felt much more comfortable by the end.

Tips for creating and maintaining a creative and safe environment included: listening for understanding, being open to new possibilities, speaking from own experiences rather than generalizations, and respectfully asking questions but focusing on ideas. Mr. Ramirez also provided an overview of bias by presening this quote: "We don't see things as they are, we see things as we are," and that we should accept each other as part of the spectrum of normalcy. There is no normal! Finally, differentiating and understanding the differences between equity, inclusion, and diversity makes for a well-rounded individual. Equity – fairness (not sameness); diversity (reality); and inclusion (not an existing space, but a choice to create a new and better space for everyone). This presentation was so rich that we really should invite Mr. Ramirez back to go more in-depth. Thank you so much for the valuable information and thought-provoking topic!
