The Quad Cities Missing Persons Network is a community-wide network of volunteers [and members] who can act quickly through the dissemination of information using social media to rally support to search for the missing person, communicate with law enforcement, media, and each other in a coordinated and focused manner. Dennis founded the Network (QCMPN) in honor of his son, the late David Harker, and other missing persons from the Quad Cities and surrounding areas. When David went missing, a massive search effort was done using Facebook, with a reach of over 650,000 people following his case from around the world through the "Help Find David Harker" Facebook page. If David was the reason for QCMPN, Carrie Olson was the catalyst. After Carrie Olson went missing, Dennis Harker, Director & the Founder with Co-Founder and former Co-Director, John Boeh, decided to form the network into a 501(c)3 nonprofit. The organization was created to address the needs of missing persons, their families, and their friends within the Quad Cities region in response to the ongoing missing person cases that continue to occur in the area, year-after-year, unresolved. The QCMPN Facebook page was created and the network's reliance upon the use of social media/networking to broadcast missing person cases increased. Typically, when a person goes missing, within the first twenty-four hours of a posting by the network on its Facebook page, it is viewed by anywhere between 50,000 to 150,000 people within the area. Within three days of a Facebook posting, this number doubles or even triples depending on the media exposure, severity, and immediacy of the case. The largest exposure of any one case was over 2 million views. On average, QCMPN sees a call volume of approximately 4 or 5 a week, 20 a month, and on average, 250 missing persons cases a year. These cases are all within 300 miles of the Quad Cities area. Most of these cases involve teenage runaways, adult, and elderly individuals suffering mental health issues or physical disability. QCMPN is a volunteer and membershipbased organization based out of Rock Island, IL. Including volunteers and members within the entire organization and its subsidiaries, QCMPN has approximately 150 volunteers and over 4,000 members. The Search and Rescue (SAR) Program is comprised of 50 volunteers, between administrative and field staff. Joining David at the rostrum was Marilyn McCallister who's 22 year old son, David went missing in 2017 and has yet to be found. Marilyn's very personal and emotion message was to not wait when a person goes missing. The police may not take action until the person has been missing 24 hours or more and in the case of adults going missing, may not take much action at all. Marilyn stressed that the first few hours can be critical and said "call (the missing person's networki) immediately and get on social media. She still searches for her son and says in her gut she knows he is probably no longer on this earth, but she needs to find proof and to know what happened. Dennis' son was found within a week of going missing, a victim of drowning in the Mississippi. Mariliyn's search continues. The Quad City Missing Person Network trains and certifies searchers, posts information and details of missisng persons on social media, provides "after-care" for families of missing persons, operates a command center for searches, holds fundraising events to defray search expenses, maintains direct contact with local media outlets, and provides chaplin services for family who request such assistance. Goals for the future include increasing the number of trained and certified searchers, adding a search dog program, and establishing a befrienders program to assist families of missing persons. Mrs. McCallister added that there are currently 600,000 missing persons in the United States. 510,000 are considered "cold cases". The remaining 90,000 are "active" cases. Of that number 50,000 are adults, the majority are males. Locally the Quad Cities has on average 50 missing persons each year. 44 are missing currently. Statewide Illinois has 400 currently missing and Iowa have over 300. Mr. Harker made to thank the Quad Cities and in particular the Moline police for the outpouring of support he received when David went missing and the quick decision by the Moline police that this was a serious missing person matter without waiting to take action. Thank you Dennis and Marilyn for the great informaton and for sharing your very sad and unfortunate stories.

#### BELL RINGING – HAVE YOU SIGNED UP?






#### **FINES – HAPPY/SAD DOLLARS**
