Curtis Lundy is Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Nahant Marsh. Prior to retirement Lundy served as Chief Financial Officer of The National Bank in Bettendorf. In addition to his work with stream cleanup, roadside vegetation and Nahant, Lundy founded a nonprofit group called Partners of Scott County Watersheds that promotes awareness, understanding of, and care for, watersheds throughout the county. He was the recipient of the first Oberholtzer Award for present-day conservation leadership at an event at Modern Woodmen Park, Davenport. Brian Ritter is the Executive Director of Nahant Marsh and the Program Director for Conservation Technology through the Eastern Iowa Community Colleges (EICC) and the Advanced Technology Environmental and Energy Center (ATEEC). He teaches EICC courses on site and uses Nahant preserve as an outdoor classroom. He also teaches a course at Saint Ambrose University. Brian has overseen operations at Nahant Marsh since 2007 and has begun and sustained many environmental education programs, biological research projects, and natural resource management practices. Nahant Marsh is a 305-acre preserve nestled in southwest Davenport. It is part of a 513-acre wetland complex that is bordered by the Mississippi River, Interstate 280, and Highway 22. The Nahant Marsh Education Center is open Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and on Saturdays from 9 a.m. to noon (extended to 3 p.m. from April through October). Trails are open daily from sunrise to sunset. If the main gate is locked, trails are accessible from the front parking lot - just look for the opening in the fence near the kiosk. A trial map is available on line. Nahant Marsh Education Center, through the Eastern Iowa Community Colleges, offers a wide variety of environmental education programming for people of all ages. Educational programs are conducted both on and off-site and provide programming that focuses on midwest ecosystems, conservation, and stewardship. Research projects are conducted year round and guide our management practices. Ongoing projects include water quality testing, turtle population monitoring, and avian population studies. Wetlands are a vital part of our ecosystems. They filter pollutants, reduce sedimentation, reduce flow, and provide habitat. Nahant Marsh is a protected natural area and their management practices strive to maintain the health and diversity of the preserve. Mr. Ritter stated that in 2019 Nahant had 22,000 visitors take part in educational programs and thousands more visited for recreational hiking and wildlife viewing. So far in 2021, 70,000 people have visited the Marsh. Nahant serves 4 principal functions: Education, Research, Conservation, and Recreation. In research the Marsh has identified a pair of Blandings Turtles, an

almost extinct speciaes, and managed to induce the female to lay eggs which were incubated and hatched. Two babies were tagged with GPS radio transmitters and are being tracked along with the parent turtles. The Marsh also discuvered Rusty Patch Bumble Bees, a species on the federal endanged list, and managed to tace them to several local areas where the species is thriving. The Sandhill Crane has been gone from our area for over 130 years but a pair was seen nesting in the Marsh and producing hatchlings. In the winter over 800 bald eagles were counted in the area. Thanks to Curtis and Dennis for making us more award of one of the Quad Cities most important ecological treasures! We are all invited to visit Nahant Marsh.

PUMPKIN PALOOZA AGAIN A HUGE HIT WITH THE KIDS!


