

Why Taiwan Matters: Small Island, **Important Place**

times between 1974 and 2018. Even though he and the programs have not "taken any side" in the Taiwan-China controversies, he has been invited by that government to attend several October 10 national day celebrations in

Taipei, meeting the President at the 100th anniversary event in 2011, and received a special recognition certificate in 2014 from the Taiwan office in Chicago for promoting "cultural and educational exchanges" with Taiwan. He has given lectures at National Taiwan University and Chinese Culture University in Taipei.

Taiwan is only one-fourth the size of Illinois but has twice as many people, fascinating landscapes, and the world's 20th largest economy with important exports such as in information-technology. Considered a part of China for several centuries, it has been independent with special connections with the U.S. for the last 71 years and now has a key role in East Asia's economic geography and complicated international relations. Dr. Moline noted that Taiwan has a population twice the size of Illinois on an island One-fourth the size of our state and because of the incredibly mountainous terrain that population is packed into



an area roughly 1/16th the size of Illinois. He is proud that Augustana and he were the first U.S. College ever to establish a study-abroad program in China, and Augustana first went there in 1974. When Taiwan, previously known as Nationalist China, and the Republic of China until recognition of the independent nation status was take away by the United Nations in 1979. At that time most colleges and Universities ceased educational relationships with Taiwan and dealt solely with the People's Republic of China (Communist China). Augustana continued its relationship with Taiwan and also built a relationship with the People's Republic. They have maintained a "neutral" and close relationship with both entities. When Taiwan celebrated their 100th anniversary of "independence" on October 10, 2011, Dr. Moline was invited to attend ceremonies at the presidential palace where he met and shook hands with the president, the first lady, and the vice-president of Taiwan. Continuing with his description of Taiwan, Moline stated that 70% of the island is mountainous. Most agricultural land and land suitable for settlements and cities is located on the Western side of the mountains. The island does experience earthquakes, typhoons, and volcanic hot springs. The East coast is mostly high cliffs dropping down into the ocean. Dr. Moline pointed out that the average farm size in Taiwan is 2.75 acres and much of the farm fields are covered to protect crops from the beating sun. The entire island is located similarly to southern Florida. The population density is 1,742 per square mile, compared to the US at 94 per square mile. Urban areas are massive, streets are packed, and motor scooters are everywhere. Turning to the importance to Taiwan, Moline state that annually they expert \$346 billion in goods, \$55.5 billion to the US, however the Peoples Republic receives \$138 billion in Taiwan exports. He noted that the two China's are codependent on one another, and their economies are tied together. For that reason, he believes war between the two is very unlikely. Thanks Dr. Moline for another fascinating and informative program!
