includes interviewing a subject in order to write and illustrate a 10 page

children's book on their life. The project is designed for students 18 and younger and integrates skills such as interviewing, researching, writing, editing, and illustrating. Never Forget Publishing, Inc then publishes the story complete with photographs, a two-page biography, and matching curriculum. In the beginning, the book project started as a dream of Deb Bowen's to preserve stories of Jewish survivors, specifically three women each named Esther. Today with over 80 books in their Holocaust series, the books tell true stories of Jewish survivors, WWII Veteran liberators and eye witnesses, and Righteous Gentiles, non-Jews who risked their lives to help Jews. Now there are two other series: Human Rights and Heroes. Several children's books are now published and available to purchase on Amazon. They also have a newsletter for continued information of new releases. Their organization's Mission Statement says, "A BOOK by ME seeks to preserve the history of the WWII generation and other human rights issues. Our desire is to preserve the stories for the classroom so lessons of tolerance, empathy, hope and respect are not lost. Deb Bowen of Aledo, Illinois, was focusing children on stories that would be lost once the Holocaust survivors have passed away. She started preserving these stories with the help of young writers and artists in 2003. Then one day, she spoke in a small town outside of Peoria, and young Jon Mattern was in the audience. He was captivated with the project and wanted to write about a survivor who immigrated near his area. Jon's mom bought the memoir of Marion Blumenthal Lazan, later titled Four Perfect Pebbles. He read it cover to cover. Then he wrote a short version of the story called Never Lose Hope which was published by Deb Bowen in the "A Book by Me" series. Many students have told Deb over the years that these small, easy to read storybooks led them to read chapter books on the topic of the Holocaust. The door will soon be closed to interview someone from the WWII generation so action must be taken now. If you know a story that needs to be written, please find a student who would be willing to interview, write, and illustrate a "Book by Me." (perhaps two students working together on the project together). Perhaps one of your own children or grandchildren would like to get involved in this project. (Writer's guidelines are at abookbyme.com) or just contact Deb Bowen and let her know you have a lead for a story. You can contact Deb Bowen at abookbyme@gmail.com. Deb and husband formed Never Forget Publishing in Aledo and now have three distinct series of books: The Holocost series, The Hero series, and The Human Rights series With Veterans Day this week, Deb concentrated her comments on the Hero Series. Deb sets up interviews for students to meet with

their "subject" usually in person, but at time via ZOOM. The students glean as much information as they can and than have the task of putting together a 10 page story based on what they learned in the interview. The stories are often fascinating and would have been lost sut for the Books By Me progrram. Just a few of the stories Deb recounted wer onf a WWII veteran that was part of the Monuments Recovery team that searched and found much of the art items stolen by the Nazis during the war. The solder was part of the protection squad that guarded the items after they were found. Another Story was of veteran Jessie Drawfor that helped liberate a Nazi concentration camp. A marine vereran, John Moon was part of the Iwo Jima invasion and was friends with several of the men who raised the iconic flag on Iow Jima. Naval veteran Dick Thelen was on the crew of the Indianapolis that was sunk in shark infested waters and many of his crewmates were attacked and eaten by sharks. Fred Foster was an army veteran who participated in the Battle of the Bulge. He told of feeling as if hew could die at anyu moment. Mrs. Bowen's 100 book was about veteran John Fairbanks who was 100 years old when interviewed. In every case the student interviewer/authors reported learning more in their short interview than in all their history classes. Deb also stated that each book includes a curricula section with execcises, reference materials, and a vocabulary flossary and a timeline. She said her goal was to preserve the stories, and hope to

cause impact, compassion, and tolerance in the reeaders. Thank you for a most interesting program!.

Last month our club hosted the first in-person joint meeting of the 11 Quad City Area Rotary Clubs in celebration of World Polio Day. From the start the evening was a great success with delicious hors d'oeuvres, a tasty buffet dinner, representatives from all clubs present, the Iowa side District Governor and our Assistant Governor present, two outstanding local polio survivor speakers, a informative Polio Day video, and participation in the program by club presidents from North Scott, Bettendorf, Davenport, Moline, East-Moline-Silvis, Geneseo, Illinois Quad Cities, River Cities, Twin Rivers RAH, and Rock Island. We had before the event television coverage on all four local television outlets and local PBS radio. WQAD come to the event and did a video and interviews on the 10pm news after the dinner. Our Club held the first Quad City area joint celebration of World Polio Day with the 7 Illinois side Rotary Clubs in 2020 via ZOOM. The expansion to include the Iowa Clubs and being able to gather together in person was a tremendous improvement this year.


