Ryan Collins, Executive Director of the Midwest Writing Center, is no stranger to the organization. His uncle, David R. Collins, along with Evelyn Witter, incorporated the Center in 1980. With the help of numerous volunteers, the Midwest Writing Center (MWC) is the only 501c3 nonprofit in the Quad Cities area that devotes 100% of its resources to literary arts programs and education.

Ryan earned his Master of Fine Arts Degree in Poetry at Columbia College in Chicago. Not only is he the Executive Director of MWC, but he also teaches college courses at St. Ambrose University.

Today's Rotary program was very interactive. Ryan first asked if there were any writers in the group. A small amount of hands went up. Then he asked if anyone ever wrote correspondence, or emails, or journaled. More hands went up. His point—everybody writes! This is one of the reasons why the tagline of the center is "Write More Light into Your Life." Midwest Writing Center believes that everyone is, or can be, a writer. As the brochure says, "Writing is a positive force in all our lives. From improving professional communications, to finding new forms of self-expression; from better organizing our thoughts and daily activities to managing stress, anxiety, and depression, the simplest writing practice can have a major impact, and be a source of light, for everyone."

Ryan went on to describe the numerous accessible programs available through the MWC. From lectures to hands-on classes, there is

There will be 10 rounds of Bingo and a prize for the winner of each Round. Your purchase of Bingo cards and participating in the accompanying silent


auction and 50/50 drawings is the "funding" for the fundraiser. Plus, the Blue Cat is donating a portion of their food and drink sales from the event.

Downtown Rock Island something for everyone at the Center. Ryan is especially passionate about the Young Emerging Writers program that meets every summer and provides paid internships to students, ages 15-19, who are interested in learning more about writing professions. Throughout the course of the summer, the students prepare to launch a literary magazine called *The Atlas*. They learn how to produce such an undertaking while also learning real life skills that result in being paid for their efforts, and end with a completed, published work to add to their portfolios. Finally, the group has a launch party for the literary magazine that draws hundreds of people in attendance. Ryan calls it "graduate-level work meets jobskills" programming. Nicely done!



Other items of interest from MWC include an annual chapbook series, named after Mary Foster and the first QC Poet Laureate, Dick Stahl. The Center receives submissions from authors representing more than a dozen states.

Finally, at the end of the talk, Rotarians had a chance to write and share their stories. Ryan explained the prompt— "Write the word 'Dear' on your paper. Now write a letter/note to something or a concept, not a person." He told us to use the "first thought, only thought" concept to come up with what we would like to recognize. After just 4 minutes of writing, numerous Rotarians stood up and read their writings. We thanked things like defibrillators, the environment, the pandemic, and the community. It was a beautiful time to reflect. Ryan encouraged us to continue doing this activity, even if you never share what you write. It's a great meditative exercise!

A big "thank you" to Ryan for spending his lunch hour with us. As the Vice-President of the MWC Board, I know first-hand how hard Ryan and his staff work to make our kids and community a success. I'm also fortunate that they are housed at the Downtown Library. It is truly an amazing sight to see the teens work all summer to produce such an incredible magazine. The other classes MWC offers are worth your time and taught by some phenomenal instructors. Their flagship program is the David R. Collins Writer's Conference, which will be held this summer, June 23-25th. I invite you all to attend some, or all, of the classes and seminars. More information can be found at www.mwcqc.org.
