DISTRICT GOVERNOR LAURA KANN

Today our very special guest speaker was Laura Kann District Governor of Rotary District 6420. Laura began her Rotary journey when she joined the Rotary Club of Dunwoody, Georgia on September 24, 2004.

She rose in leadership and served as club President. Both Laura and her husband Charles (Wick) Warren worked for the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Upon Wick's retirement in December 2014, they moved from Decatur, Georgia to Princeton, Illinois to be near Laura's mother and father. Soon after moving to Princeton in November 2014, Laura's father, Douglas Kann, passed away in March of 2015. Douglas was a member

of the Rotary Club of Princeton for over 40 years. Her mother, Lucille Kann, is now 88 years young. Living in Princeton, Laura continued her service responsibilities for the Dunwoody Club and Rotary District 6900. She also continued working for the CDC, making monthly trips to Atlanta, until her retirement in August 2017. She resigned from the Dunwoody Club on June 30, 2018. The Rotary Club of Dunwoody elected Laura to honorary membership in 2018. Laura became a very active member of the Rotary Club of Princeton, Illinois which she joined July 1, 2018. Laura served on the Board of Directors and chaired their annual Rotary Auction for the club's centennial year in 2020. In addition, she served on their 100th Anniversary Committee, the Community Service Committee, and the Rotary Foundation Committee. She also became active in District 6420, serving as the District Grant Subcommittee Chair. In that role she conducted three annual District Grant Management Training Seminars for Club Officers throughout the District. She also was a speaker at the 2019 District 6420 Conference and the 2019 District 6420 Foundation Dinner and speaks to Clubs about a wide range of Rotary Foundation topics. She became the District Governor Nominee in 2020, the District Governor Elect in 2021, and was installed as our District Governor 2022-23. She began her comments today noting that the Presidential Theme for Rotary International this year is "Imagine Rotary." She said this is not going to be a "business as usual" year. She described the meaning of the various parts of the logo created with Imagine Rotary. Then she said, "Imagine a World without Polio. Imagine a World without Poverty. Imagine a World without Illiteracy and Imagine a World with Peace. These are things Rotary can do." Governor Kann then singled out members of our Club for being a part of Rotary's efforts. She said Ruth Lee, Bud Phillis, John Wetzel, and Fred & Virginia Houlton are Rotary Major Donors, signifying substantial gifts to Rotary. She thanked Ruth Lee and Fred Houlton for their service as past District Governors of our District. She then noted that 33 current members of our Club are Paul Harris Fellows, signifying donations of over \$1,000 each to Rotary International. Her comments then shifted to goals set by our newly installed Rotary International President, Jennifer E. Jones. President Jones says every Rotary Club must adopt a "Comfort & Care" philosophy. Meaning our Club needs to be welcoming, a safe-harbor, and inclusive. Governor Kann identified "D.E.I.", diversity, equity, and inclusion as essential for membership growth. She stated that our District has implemented policies (available on the district website) including a Strategic Plan, a Youth Protection Policy, and a \$50,000 Disaster Relief Fund and suggested that we all go online and read those policies. She urges all of us to give at whatever level we can to the Rotary International Foundation, saying "that is how we do good in the world." She also pointed out that Charity Navigator rates the Rotary Foundation at the very top of all charitable organizations in transparency, efficiency, and impact. She reminded us that for every dollar we donate to Polio Plus the Bill Gates Foundation matches it with two dollars, effectively tripling our donations. She also said that donations to the Rotary Annual Fund support all of Rotary's initiatives other than Polio and reminded us that 48% of each donation to the Annual Fund is returned to our District for local control of how it is used. The Governor spoke of our new District wide project to provide new books to local libraries. She asked that a book be donated for, or by, every member of our Club. In closing she invited and urged us all to attend the District Conference scheduled for November 4-5, 2022, on the campus of Northern Illinois University. She named several of the very impressive speakers line up for the Conference. Thank you Governor Kann for an inspiring program!

FOUNDATION MINUTE

Welcome to Week 4 of RI's Month of Transition!

Recognizing that education is a pathway out of poverty, TRF highlights the provision of quality education as one sterling means of advancing world understanding, goodwill, and peace. Barb Roberts, a member of the Rotary Club of Taree on Manning (AUS) had been teaching in the Manning Valley Schools for many years, before deciding in 2015 to travel to Bhutan for 16 days on a photography tour. On her return, and for the next three years, this Rotarian raised funds to return to the remote corners of Eastern Bhutan with teaching resources and books written in English.

Roberts' efforts were crowned with tremendous success when TRF awarded her club US\$30,000 for vocational training in Bhutan. She has since returned to the Tang Valley in Central Bhutan to introduce Western style library services to schools in isolated areas of Bhutan. Congratulating Rotarian Roberts and her club, the Foundation director, Maurie Stack explained the possibility of more funds. "At the moment, it is a US \$30,000 project and it is great to have those funds approved through the Foundation; however, more funds can enable Barb to meet transport costs and provide more books."
