Work is schedule to begin soon according to Aaron Lubitz and Ken Harris of Valley Construction, the Rock Island based contractor for the project. Harris was the chief estimater for the job and Lubitz will be the project manager.

The project includes Rock Island's first "roundabout" in the downtown area. Lubitz began the presentation stating that the city's concept of the project is to make the downtown area a more friendly and appealing area where people will want to be. The hope is that by renovating all the area's infrastructure, much unseen such as sewer and water lines, in addition to the highly visible aspects of paving,

lighting, landscaping, and a grassy park area people will see the area as a welcoming and fun area and business owners will be attracted to locate and expand there. Where people gather, businesses tend to open and grow. There project area runs from 1st Avenue to 3rd Avenue and from 18th to 19th street. It includes reopening 2nd Avenue for traffic, but with parking not allowed and the ability to quickly close the area for pedestrian events. Curbs will be removed to eliminate tripping hazzards and the street will not be "crowned" to further accommodate pedestrian use. A welcoming arched entrance into the downtown area will be added. The roundabout will be at the intersection of 18th Street and 2nd Avenue. Lubitz cited studies showing that roundabouts not only improve traffic flow, but also slow traffic at intersections and decrease the incidence and seriousness of accidents. An included part of the project is renovation and improvement of Arts Alley. That area will receive festive lighting, decorative pavement, and although not included in Valley's part of the project, will include colorful murals for the building walls. Second Avenue will also receive some mini-park areas for outdoor dining and relaxation. Harris presented a powerpoint slide show of concept renderings of how the completed project will look. Work will begin very shortly and will be extensive with streets, sewers, and watermains removed and replaced. Completion of the total project is anticipated to take about a year. The Rock Island City Council approved the project just last night and with the addition of alternatives approved will come in a bit over \$8 million, mostly paid by state and federal grants, plus city and downtown property owners and merchant funds. Rotary thanks Ken and Aaron for a very informative and interesting presentation.

ROTARY FOUNDATION MINUTE

UNESCO's Institute for Water Education recently announced information regarding a Rotary Foundation sponsored Global Scholarship. According to the report published online at https://www.un-ihe.org/education/master-programmes/rotary-scholarships-water-and-sanitation-professionals, the strategic partnership between The Rotary Foundation (TRF) and IHE Delft Institute for Water Education aims to tackle the world's water and sanitation crisis by increasing the number of trained professionals to devise, plan, and implement solutions in developing and emerging countries.

Through this partnership, scholarships are awarded annually for graduate students at IHE Delft's campus in the Netherlands. These scholarships are designed to promote long-term productive relationships between Rotarians and highly skilled water and sanitation professionals in their communities. Since the inception of the partnership in 2012, over 165 scholarships have been awarded. Recipients of this Rotary scholarship will benefit from the support they receive through regular contact with sponsor Rotarians from their home country and the opportunity to interact with Rotarians in the Netherlands/

Rotary alumni constitute an extensive network of Rotary scholarship recipients and Rotarians worldwide. Becoming involved with a local Rotary Club and the alumni association allows scholars to stay connected to Rotary's global community and resources. Students admitted to IHE Delft Institute for Water Education's Master of Science program in Water and Sustainable Development (68EC) can be nominated by a local Rotary Club in their home community by submitting the application form for a scholarship to the Rotary/IHE Delft committee in the Netherlands, together with the student's resume and the IHE Delft admission letter. Rotarian support for the Rotary Foundation makes this possible!
