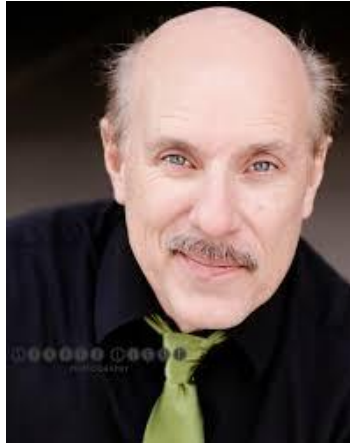

## Jeff Adamson Little Known Rock Island History



Jeff Adamson is the former executive producer/owner of *ComedySportz Quad Cities* and former owner and executive producer of the Establishment Theater in Moline. He says from a very early age, he realized he was a people person. So performing is in his blood. Stand up comedy, Improvisational comedy, film roles, commercial work, auctioneering, corporate training, and now playwriting and authoring is benefiting from his talents. He says, "I'm living the dream". He is also the executive producer/owner of *Guys In Ties* an improv comedy troupe that specializes in corporate training presentations. His latest venture is one we saw a bit of today. He is the proud author of "*Twisted Tales of the Quad Cities*". He speaks about little known history of Rock Island and the Quad Cities along with a incredible slide show collection illustrating his interesting narrative. He authored a book titled *Twisted Tales of the Quad Cities* featuring many of his tales illustrated by vintage photos. His comedic background made his presentation and book lots of fun! Some of us recognized Jeff as the past owner of Mama Compton's Restaurant with many lamenting the closing of that fine food establishment in downtown Rock Island. Regardless of what hat Jeff is wearing, he is a very funny and entertaining man!

Jeff began his hysterical historical tour by noting that Rock Island was part of Connecticut for 13 years. He showed a official colonial map to prove it! Did you know that the Centennial Bridge was originally planned to be a tunnel under the Mississippi to ensure that barge and boat traffic on the river would not be impeded. However the cost was higher than building a bridge and they couldn't figure out how to ventilate such a long tunnel, so we got a bridge instead! Centennial Bridge was also the first 4-lane bridge to cross the Mississippi. Just half a mile east the original Arsenal bridge was the first bridge to cross the Mississippi River. The bridge was hit by the river boat Effie Afton soon after the bridge was built causing a large center section to burn and collapse. Did you know Mark Twain (Samuel Clemens) was on the Effie Afton and along with all the other passengers had to swim to shore when the boat sank. A law suit over the damages ensued between the boat owners and the railroad. Abe Lincoln a young attorney represented the railroad and won the case. Did you know that the upper deck of the bridge (now the 4<sup>th</sup> replacement of the Arsenal Bridge) carries two sets of railroad tracks and the bridge can support two trains plus cars on the lower deck with ease. Were you aware that originally the streets in Davenport, which was founded in 1836 by Antoine Le Claire were named for Le Claire's favorite, Indian tribes? After his death the city changed the names to numbered streets. Did you know that the original Courthouse in Davenport built on timbers sunk in the sandy soil gradually sank into the ground. Seems the termites occupied the soil and they found the timbers to be delicious and as they ate, the courthouse sank. It was replaced long ago! Bet you didn't know that the Rock Island Rapids were originally surveyed by a young West Point graduate named Robert E. Lee! We also learned that Sylvan Island wasn't originally an island. It was a peninsula and part of Moline. When the locks were built they cut through the far eastern end of the peninsula allowing the area to flood and carry more water down the Illinois side of the Mississippi into the locks. Did you know that the Arsenal Roller Dam is the largest roller dam in the world? We see only the top of the rollers which are twenty-five feet tall!

## FOUNDATION MINUTE

The Haiti National Water, Sanitation and Hygiene Initiative (HANWASH) has been selected by the Rotary International Foundation as the recipient of its annual Programs of Scale Grant. The announcement was made on May 18, after an earlier pre-announcement to hundreds of Rotarians at the District 7020 Conference in Kingston, Jamaica. Launched in 2017 by Barry Rassin, a Bahamian past Rotary International president, HANWASH has so far operated in five of Haiti’s 147 communes, aiming to deliver sustainable access to potable water nationwide. “This is an amazing moment for us,” Rassin said. “It has put District 7020 in a place where few districts around the world could even think to be.”

The grant follows a competitive process that began in August 2025 with a concept note, according to Marlene Gay, a HANWASH board member and past president of the Rotary Club of Pétiön-Ville. Of more than 60 applicants, HANWASH was shortlisted to three before submitting a full proposal and undergoing vetting that included consultations with Haitian officials, mayors and water authorities.... Over five years, the aim is to establish sustainable water systems — piped networks and wells in urban areas, and solar-powered pumps in rural ones. The initiative adopts a systems approach, acting as a convener that brings together stakeholders before handing over management to local authorities.

Rotary International, the world’s largest service organization, has a track record in such efforts. Its End Polio Now campaign has eliminated poliomyelitis in most countries; only Pakistan and Afghanistan remain endemic.

Jeff tells that trolleys were a big important business in the early Quad Cities. They did a huge business during the week taking people to work and back home, but on weekends sat mostly idle. So, the trolley companies established many of our area parks including Campbells Island, Credit Island, Prospect Park, and Watch Tower Park. Many had amusement rides including roller coasters. Trolleys then did a big business taking weekend fun lovers to their parks! Would you believe that Molette was a housing development in Moline funded by local lumber companies. They built 517 homes in just 18 months. A brand-new home sold for \$5,000! Many members had heard about the NFL being born in Rock Island with the Rock Island Independents and Jim Thorp playing at Douglas Park, but did you know that on October 29, 1949, in Moline's Wharton Fieldhouse, the Tri-Cities Blackhawks notched a 93-85 victory over the visiting Denver Nuggets. It was the first NBA game ever played! We also learned that the first successful appendectomy took place in Davenport in 1888. On final delicious tidbit. Did you know that Dairy Queen originated in Moline and that not long after a disgruntled employee quit and formed Tasty Freeze. Both delicious treats were created and first established in Moline. We thank Jeff for his fun filled presentation of little-known history of our community! Many of us purchased his book!

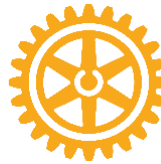
